- Consistency with existing state and federal law, grant requirements, and in the interest of the public.




Models: Agreements, Policies, Approach

City CIP Agreements : Existing Provisions

- **Prevailing Wages** *set by CA Labor Code* Hourly wage rate of per diem wages set forth in the prevailing wage rate schedule
- Apprentice Requirements set by CA Labor Code Ratio not less than 1 hour of apprentice work for each 5 hours of journeyman work

• Liquidated damages

Contractor pays City liquidated damages for each day delay over and above the number of working days prescribed for finishing the work in the amount shown of the Standard Specifications.
