Process

- Technical review by staff to determine:
 - artwork can be legally donated or loaned to the City;
 - durability, safety and anticipated maintenance needs of the artwork;
 - ongoing financial costs associated with accepting the gift or loan of artwork can be met;
 - availability of an appropriate site for the artwork.
- Aesthetic review by the APPC, according to the following criteria:
 - artwork demonstrates excellence in aesthetic quality, workmanship, innovation and creativity;
 - artwork demonstrates appropriateness in scale and form, and is of materials/media suitable for the site; and
 - artwork builds the diversity of the Public Art Collection.
- Staff and APPC provide a recommendation to the City Manager or his/her designee.

- Technical review:
 - Yes, artwork can be legally donated or loaned to the City;

 - Confirmed appropriate site for the artwork.
- Aesthetic review by the APPC, according to the following criteria:
 - Does artwork demonstrate excellence in aesthetic quality, workmanship, innovation and creativity?
 - Does artwork demonstrate appropriateness in scale and form, and is of materials/media suitable for the site?
 - Does artwork build the diversity of the Public Art Collection?
