RFP Purpose

Professional consulting services to prepare a five-year Homelessness Solutions Strategic Plan and step-bystep action plan to address homelessness in the community and achieve "Functional Zero" homelessness in alignment with the Sonoma County Continuum of Care (CoC).

- Phase 1: Conduct Assessment of Existing Systems and Stakeholders
- Phase 2: Synthesis and Draft Plan Development
- Phase 3: Finalize and Approve

Agreement

- Budget \$100,000
- \$89,335 + \$10,665
- Initial 6-month period March 1 to August 31, 2022
- Option to extend for additional 6month period – September 1, 2022 to February 28, 2023

Recommendation

It is recommended by the City Manager's Office that the Council, by resolution: 1) approve a Professional Services Agreement with Focus Strategies (Walnut, CA) for the development of a Homelessness Solutions Strategic Plan in the amount of \$100,000 for an initial six-month period (March 1, 2022 to August 31, 2022) with an option to extend for an additional six-month period (September 1, 2022 to February 28, 2023); and 2) authorize the Chief Financial Officer to appropriate \$100,000 for this purpose from Homeless Fund 1209 reserves.
