I hope you all had a wonderful thanksgiving! At Boys & Girls Clubs, we are grateful for your commitment & service to our community.

Tonight, as you consider how best to spend one-time monies, you'll hear from a number of Club families, parents, community members, and others asking for your investment in this critical project. I think you'll agree there is strong community need & support for this project. You'll even hear how the Club has changed the lives of many youth from the Roseland Neighborhood.

- COMMUNITY CHALLENGE: There is a lack of recreational & emergency shelter space in Santa Rosa & in the neighborhood.
- HOW WE HELP: We will have a regulation sized basketball gym available for community use. This can also be used in case of emergency.
  FACT: All Boys & Girls Clubs facilities are registered with Red Cross as community shelters. We'd be proud to partner with the city in Roseland.
- COMMUNITY CHALLENGE: There is a lack of access to a community center or meeting space to use for events, community services, programming, etc.
- HOW WE HELP: We will have rooms available in the mornings, evenings and on the weekends for the community & other agencies to use.

Thank you to Council Members Tibbetts, Rogers, and Alvarez for signing on to support the project. I encourage others of you to support tonight. Together, we have the opportunity to impact kids, Roseland, and thousands of Santa Rosa families for years to come.
