

Temporary Urgency Change Order

- State Water Board Order issued July 28, 2020
 - Upper Russian River minimum flows 50 cfs
 - Lower Russian River minimum flows 60 cfs
- Target water supply storage levels for Lake Mendocino to guide flow regimes by Sonoma Water
- Numerous requirements for Sonoma Water
 - One specific to retailers targeted conservation reporting








Lake Mendocino Storage and Target Water Supply Storage Levels

2020 Irrigation Season – Current Conditions

- Current storage at 251 mg
 - Alternating irrigation schedule still in effect
 - 31 customers have used their allocations
- Transfer from Sonoma Water has ceased
 - SW has less water available than they projected (45 mg vs 100 mg)
- Delta Pond repairs are well-started
 - No impact on overall supply
 - Delivery challenges being managed
- Geysers pipeline repairs delayed




2020 Irrigation Season -Communications

- May 20 email communications
- Twice-monthly allotment updates to customers
- Storage curve available on website
- Ag customers added to weekly Site Supervisor emails with storage curve

2020 Operational Strategy

- •1.7 billion gallons expected for irrigation this year. This is 15% below average
- •Irrigation will be coordinated to balance demand with availability through mid-September
- •No Allotments this year. City staff will communicate with users throughout irrigation season
- Expecting 100 million gallons from Sonoma
 Water
- •City-owned farms will have a 50% reduction in irrigation compared to last year
