Pool Rebates

- 1. Pool Removal Rebate
- 2. Pool Cover Rebate





Pool Removal Rebate

- Rebates the replacement of in-ground swimming pools and inground spas with qualifying low-water use plants.
- Incentivizing customers to replace their pool with a low-water landscape will:
 - Result in greater water savings than if the pool is replaced with turf, a high-water landscape.
 - Result in greater environmental benefits than if the pool is replaced with turf or a patio.





Background on Pools in Santa Rosa

- ~ 2,650 residential swimming pools in service area.
- ~ Four residential pool removal permits are filed annually in Santa Rosa.
- Pool removal permit fees in Santa Rosa are typically \$160.
- Average size of a residential in-ground pool in CA is 450 sq. ft.



Pool Removal Rebate Details

- Offered as part of the Green Exchange Program
 - Rebate maximum: 1,000 square feet at \$0.75/sq. ft.
 - Replacement landscape must meet same requirements as in Cash for Grass

Real-world Example: 387 sq. ft. pool

387 sq. ft. x \$0.75/sq. ft. = \$290.25 rebate





Proposed Rebate Compared to Other Agencies

Agency	Amount
Santa Rosa Water (proposed)	\$0.75/square foot. Up to \$750.
Valley Water	Normally - \$1.00/square foot Drought Special - \$2.00/square foot. Up to \$3,000.
City of Scottsdale, AZ	\$1.00/square foot + \$200.00 base. Up to \$1,500.



Water Savings and Cost Estimates

- 4,950 gallons saved each year for an average pool in Santa Rosa.
- Estimated rebate participation: 4 pool removals per year
 - Would result in 19,800 gallons saved each year after
 - 25-year water savings: 1.52 acre-feet
- Rebate cost to Santa Rosa Water: approx. \$1,350 per year



Pool Cover Rebate



Pool Cover Rebate

- Incentive to install a cover for a residential pool to prevent water loss due to evaporation.
- In addition to water savings, pool covers reduce the amount of energy used to heat the pools by 50-70% and reduce the amount of chemicals being added to the pool by 35-60%.







Pool Cover Rebate Background

- ~2,650 residential swimming pools in the Santa Rosa Water service area.
- Average size of a residential in-ground pool in CA is 450 sq. ft.
- Pool cover life expectancy:
 - Bubble covers last 2-7 years
 - Foam covers last 8-12 years
 - Solid track covers last 7-11 years
- Several other municipalities in CA offer similar pool cover rebates.



Pool Cover Rebate Details

- Qualifying pool cover types:
 - Bubble (solar) cover
 - Foam cover
 - Solid track cover
- Qualifying pool cover must:
 - Cover at least 75% of the pool surface area.
 - Be new; not used, secondhand or handmade.
- Rebate application will be available online and at our office.







Proposed Rebate Compared to Other Agencies

Agency	Amount
Santa Rosa (proposed)	\$50 or price of cover, whichever is less.
North Marin Water District	\$50 or 25% of price of cover, whichever is less. Drought special: \$75 or 50% of price of cover, whichever is less.
Marin Municipal Water District	\$100 or cost of cover, whichever is less.
Contra Costa Water District	\$50 or cost of cover, whichever is less.
City of Corona	\$50 or price of cover, whichever is less.
City of Fresno	\$100 or price of cover, whichever is less.
Walnut Valley Water District	\$50 for purchase of any new pool cover with a minimum cost of \$100.
Mesa Water District	\$50 or price of cover, whichever is less.



Water Savings and Cost Estimates

- 12,325 gallons saved each year per qualifying pool cover
- Estimated participation: 10 rebates per year
- Rebate cost to Santa Rosa Water: \$500 per year
- 2-year program water savings: 0.76 acre-foot

Rebate Funds and Communication

- CIP budget is available for rebate increase
 ~\$461,000 total dollars available
- All rebates are available first come, first served with budget available
- If approved, rebate will be enacted February 1
- Outreach will include: social media, bill insert, website

Recommendation

It is recommended by the Water Department that the Water Conservation Subcommittee approve the Pool Removal Rebate and Pool Cover Rebate as described.
