- Total \$10.3m approx.



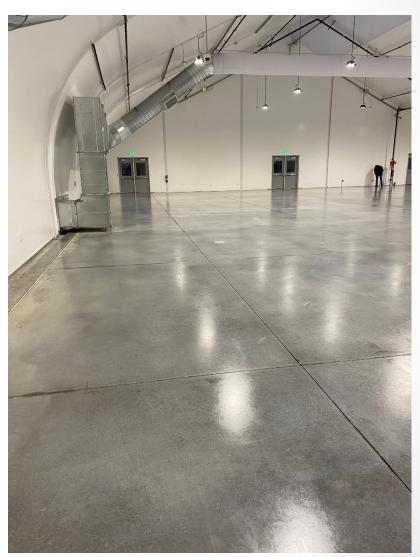

### **TPW Debris Removal**

- Dedicated 2-person crew with equipment
- Team will address all roadside, park, pathway and creek debris including bulky and homeless related items
- Crew will work proactively on predetermined routes and reactively based on daily work orders
- Dedicated phone number, email and category on MySantaRosa

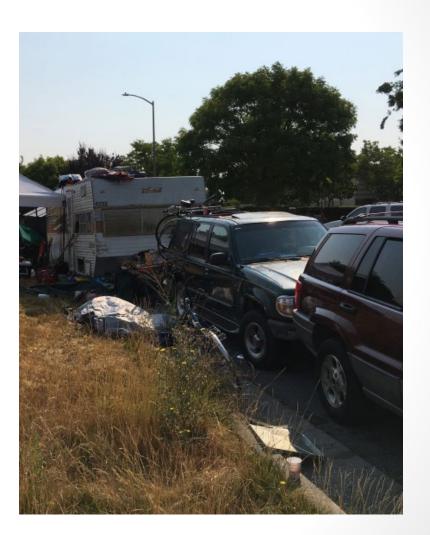

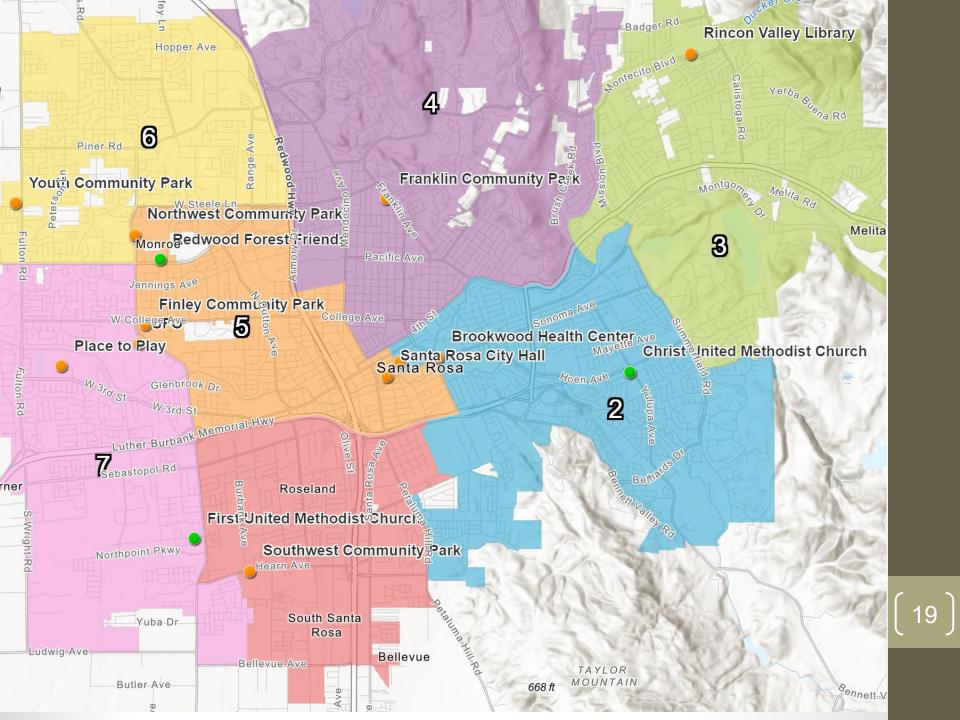

- Evaluation
  - 100 City-owned properties
  - Parks, facilities, parking district
  - Criteria # of spaces, hours of operation, prox. to neighborhoods, schools/childcare, lighting/visibility, accomm. large vehicles, environmental, community benefit, fire risk, proximity to services, geographic distribution
  - Former/existing Safe Parking sites

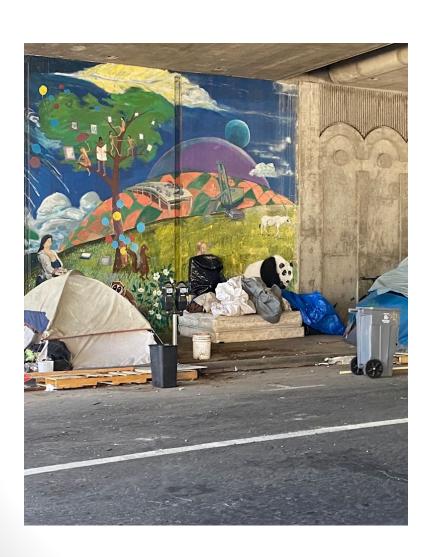

### **Alternative Shelter**

- Assumptions
  - Single site, 24/7 operations/management
  - Size subject to site opportunities/constraints
  - \$150,000 month/operations
  - \$1.8 million year/operations
  - Plus site/capital costs
  - Request for Proposals

## **RV Parking Ordinance**

- Establish ordinance to:
  - Restrict RV overnight parking throughout the City
  - Require permits for residents to temporarily park at their home
  - Require permit for visitors to temporarily park at an approved address
  - Would require enforcement and development of a permit process
  - Capital cost includes signage on entry locations to the City ~\$15k
  - Operational cost would include enforcement and permit processing estimated at \$100k annually.

## **Budget Impact**

- City General Fund Reserves approx. \$5
  million \$20.8 million below 15%
  Council-mandated threshold
  - Funding of Tier 2 Workplan is unbudgeted
  - Fund through Reserves or reallocate from existing program and/or project funding

## Summary/Next Steps

- Continue with Existing Programs
- Continue with COVID Response
- Explore & seek funding for Tier 2 efforts?
  - □ SJH/Sprung Structure Phase 2
    - \$3 million one-time capital expense
    - \$1 million/year for operations
  - Safe Parking RFP
    - \$165k \$530k/year for operations
  - ☐ Alternative Shelter RFP
    - \$1.8M/year for operations + capital expense
  - RV Parking Ordinance
    - \$100k/year for enforcement + \$15k for signs
