RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Police Department that the Council, by resolution, authorize the Chief of Police, or designee, to accept the grant award from the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control available annually as part of the Alcohol Policing Partnership in the amount of \$46,722 and approve and execute all related award documents required for receiving such funds pursuant to the terms and conditions of the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The goal of this grant project is to carry out a multi-tiered and comprehensive approach aimed at reducing alcohol-related issues within Santa Rosa, especially those issues pertaining to problematic premises/areas and public events. The grant award will support Santa Rosa Police Department's proposed project tiers focused on improving alcohol education, prevention and enforcement.

BACKGROUND

In recent years, the City of Santa Rosa has experienced a boom in the hospitality and entertainment industry. There are presently 633 on-sale and off-sale alcohol beverage licenses within the City limits. The Police Department recognizes the importance of addressing the increased need for alcoholic beverage law enforcement, prevention and education.

Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) announced funding to broaden and increase the level of alcoholic beverage law enforcement by working in partnership with local municipalities through a grant assistance project. On June 9, 2020, the Santa Rosa Police Department was selected to receive funding for FY 2020-2021 Alcohol Policing Partnership (APP) grant sponsored by ABC.

1. Accepting this funding will allow the Santa Rosa Police Department to administer a comprehensive and strategic multi-disciplinary approach aimed at reducing alcohol-related incidents within Santa Rosa.
