



GENERAL SERVICES AGREEMENT EF001552 – CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION SERVICES FOR FIRE IMPACTED STORM DRAINS

BACKGROUND

- October 9, 2017 – the Director of Emergency Services proclaimed the existence of a local emergency
- October 13, 2017 - City Council passed Resolution No. ES-2017-201 ratifying the Proclamation of the Existence of a Local Emergency
- In November, it was discovered that sections of existing High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) storm drain pipes were destroyed or severely damaged due to the fires

BACKGROUND (cont.)

- Issue was elevated to FEMA
- November 10, 2017 – City’s EOC and DOC were re-opened to assess storm drain damage ahead of forecasted rain events
- Approximately 41 miles of storm drain were inspected by CCTV by City forces, other agencies and through contracted services by TerraCon Constructors, Inc.

ANALYSIS

- City had existing on-call contract with TerraCon Constructors
- New contract was drafted in order to meet FEMA contracting requirements
- Due to the emergency nature of the work, the contract was not executed at that time
- Council approval of the GSA is needed in order to process payment for services rendered

BENEFIT

- CCTV emergency work identified a total of 14 high priority locations where an imminent threat to the life, health, and safety of the public or significant risk to public infrastructure or property existed
- Repair work was completed under emergency contracts.

RECOMMENDATION

- It is recommended by the Water Department that the Council, by resolution, award and ratify General Services Agreement EF001552 in the amount of \$149,000.00 to TerraCon Constructors, Inc. of Healdsburg, California, for Closed Circuit Television services previously performed to assess storm drain damage related to the October 2017 wildfires.
