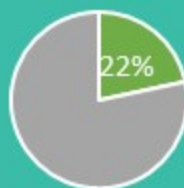

USACE received a debris/removal management mission from FEMA in Lake, Mendocino, Napa and Sonoma Counties. To date, **1,644,619** tons of debris have been removed. That's equal to the weight of about one-and-four fifths Golden Gate bridges. USACE is working with our local, state and federal partners on the largest wildfire cleanup in California history.

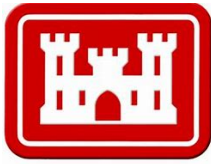

Debris Removal Operations

As of 4-6-2018 (Sonoma County)

- Cal OES, FEMA, & USACE are currently working with each county to cross-reference data and APNs (Assessor's Parcel Number) and validate the status of every parcel in the program.
- Currently, as part of our quality assurance process we are working parcels that are in the final preparation phase requiring additional debris removal as well requiring further action such as soil testing, re-scrapes, installation of erosion control, and car removal.
- The debris hotline is still operating and continues to receive questions and concerns raised by homeowners in regards to debris removal activities. We've found that most property owners have been satisfied with the work to their properties. Less than 10% of property owners within Sonoma County have called into the hotline USACE is working through the issue resolution process and evaluating whether further actions are needed.

Debris Removal Property Owner Issue Resolution Process

Issue Resolution Form

Issues reported through Info Line or other means. Form outlines the who, what, when, where and how.

Data Collection

USACE team reviews Issue Resolution Form, Right of Entry, Site Assessment, and other relevant facts.

If needed, a site visit and interviews are conducted.

Technical Review and Analysis

USACE field staff determines whether issue was caused by normal debris clearance operations. Any damage will be evaluated on a case by case basis to determine if corrective action is warranted.

Response and Resolution

Property owners will be contacted by USACE regarding how their issue will be resolved.
