# FY 22/23 Accomplishments Rental Housing Assistance

Emergency Housing Voucher lease-ups – 80 housed/ 21 vouchers looking

• 1,577 unit inspections completed- biennial, move in, quality control

Transitioned from paper to electronic waiting list- record 7,296 applicants

• 73 PBVs committed: Caritas (30), 3575 Mendocino Ave Phases I and 2 (30), and Cannery at RR Square (33); projects are also receiving development funding

EHV- 100% lease up rate

HCV- 98% lease up rate

HCV resources to support preservation / development



# FY 22/23 Accomplishments Housing Trust

- Completed Linda Tunis Sr Apartments- first 2017 wildfire funded project constructed in CA - 26 affordable units for seniors /13 PBVs
- Completed Boyd Commons 45 affordable units
- Bennett Valley Apts soon to be under construction- former BV Senior Center
- CDBG-DR projects- Linda Tunis completed; Caritas Phase I, 3575 Mendocino Ave Phase I, and Cannery at RR Sq under construction; Burbank Ave Apts securing additional funding
- Monitored 5,300 units
