The Russian River watershed is a rich and diverse region of nearly 1500 square miles of forests, agricultural lands and urban lands in Mendocino and Sonoma Counties. The mainstem of the Russian River flows 110 miles from its headwaters near Redwood Valley and Potter Valley to the Pacific Ocean near Jenner. The watershed is home to approximately 360,000 people, 150 streams and creeks, and about 30 species of fish three of which are listed as threatened or endangered, Chinook salmon, Coho salmon and Steelhead trout.

The Russian River Watershed Association was formed in 2003 to create opportunities for our member agencies to expand their stewardship role in the watershed.



#### It's Time to Plant a Rain Garden


