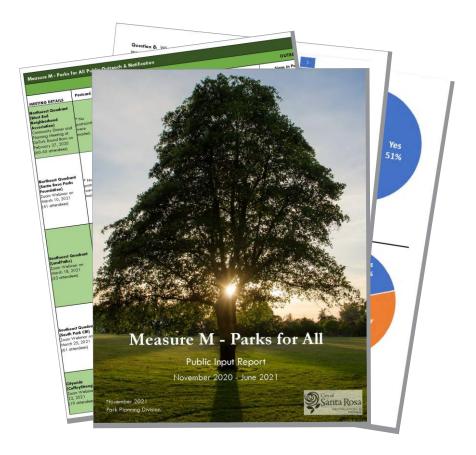
Countywide Sales tax (25%) over 10 years:

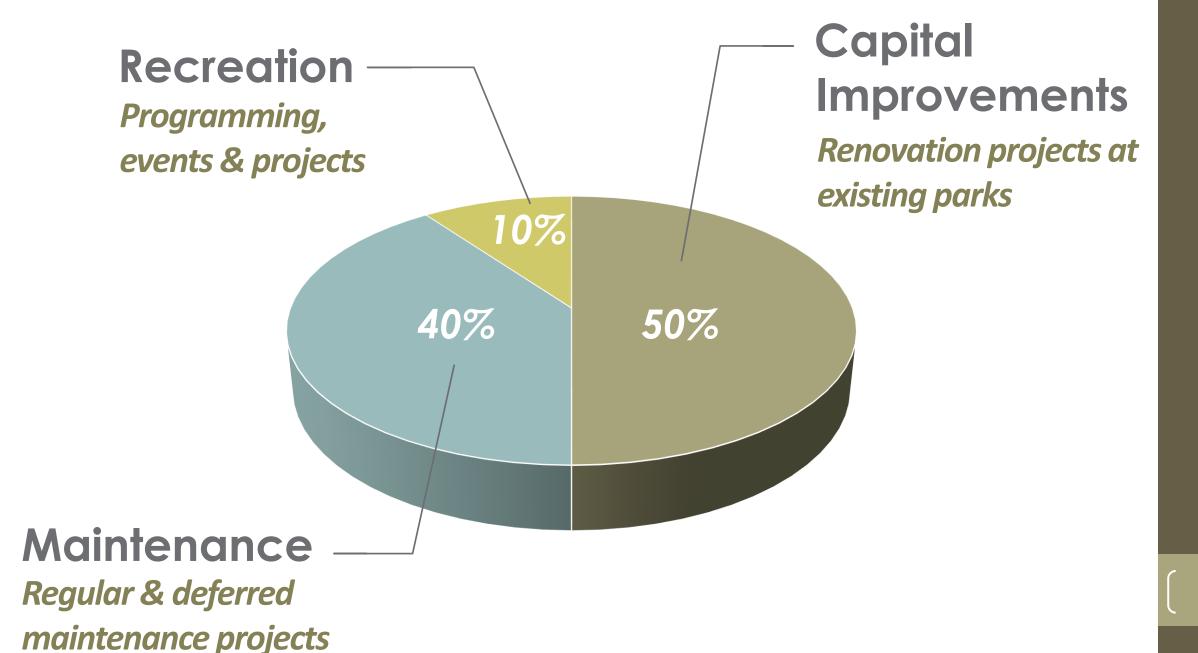

 accessible visitor experiences

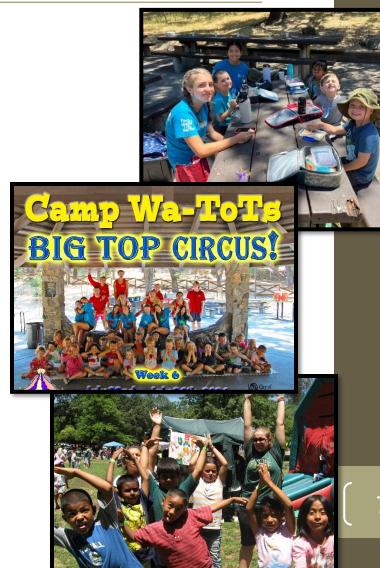
 Decrease fire risk – manage and reduce fuel loads throughout the park system and particularly, city owned open space parks

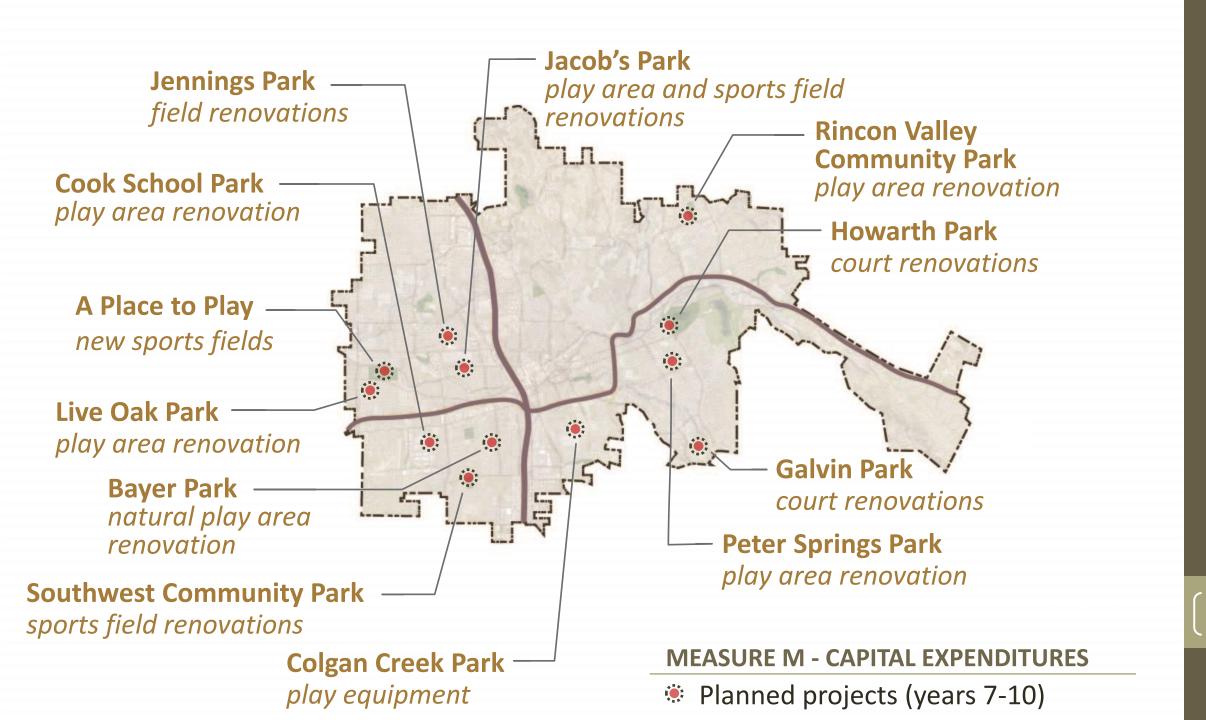

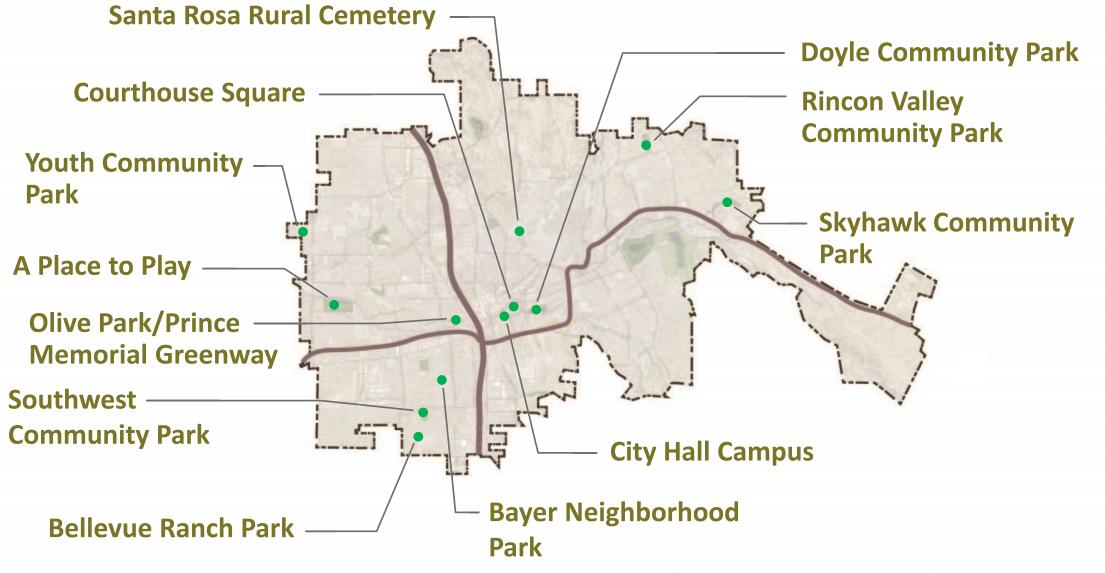

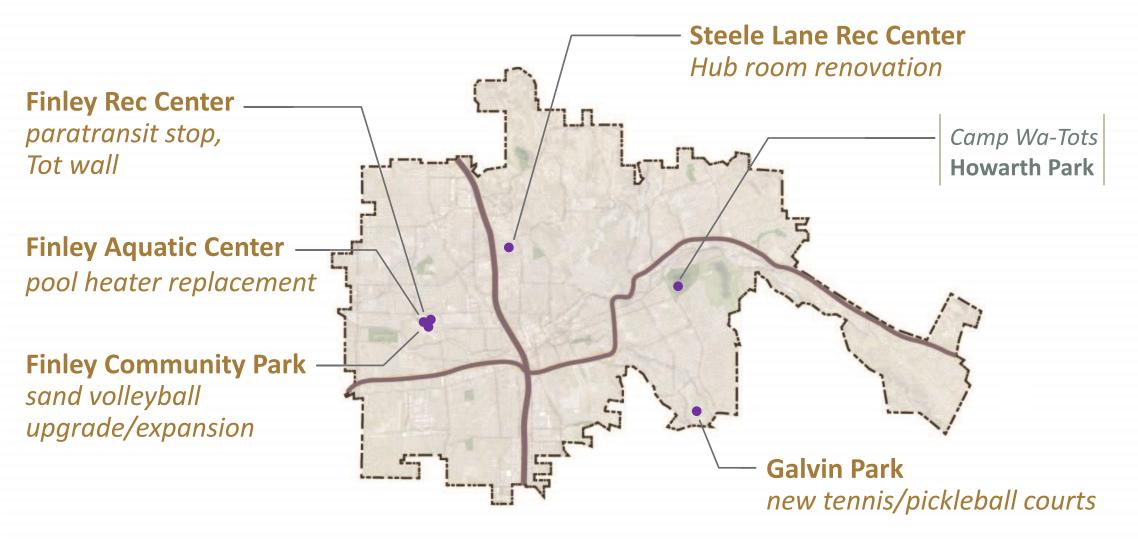
