MGPTF Accomplishments

- Funded and supported direct services to community
- Developed Implementation Plan for 2012-2016 Strategic Plan
- Secured \$500,000 in CalGRIP funding for two years
- Hosted joint meeting of the Policy and Operational Teams in June 2013
- Hosted 5th Annual Gang Prevention Awareness Week, with over 2,000 participants

MGPTF Accomplishments

- Met with State Legislators in Sacramento regarding Re-Entry and Regionalization efforts
- Provided technical assistance to other municipalities, such as Sonoma, Long Beach, Colusa County, and the Board of State and Community Corrections
- Next month: participation on a panel at the National League of Cities conference in Seattle

Law Enforcement Update

- **Created quarterly gang crime statistics report**
- **Notable YTD highlights from January – June 2013:**
 - 17% decline in total gang crime incidents
 - 23% decline in crimes against persons
 - 25% decline in property crimes
- **Gang crime is 4% of all crime**

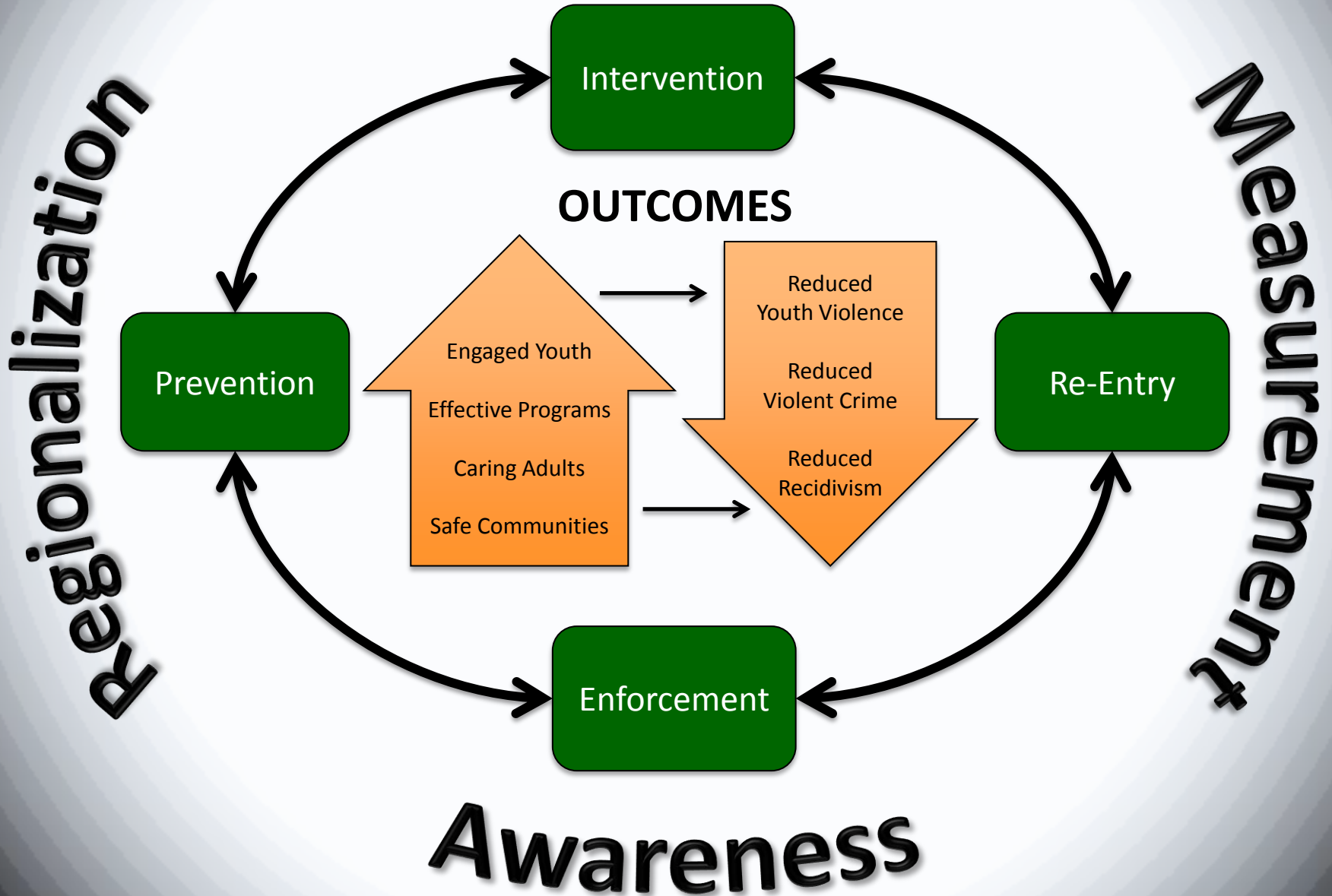
