 $V_{icc} \, M_{ayor}$ AB 557 would preserve an effective tool for local agencies facing emergencies that would otherwise prevent them from conducting the people's business. The changes made to VICTORIA FLEMING California Government Code section 54953 by Assembly Bill 361 (R. Rivas, 2021) were of vital JEFF OKREPKIE importance to local agencies looking to meet during the COVID-19 pandemic to continue to conduct the people's business. These changes were necessary to permit local agencies to meet during a time that it would have otherwise been impossible to meet in-person safely. Important safeguards were included to ensure transparency and accountability, including the fact that the emergency provisions were only applicable in instances where the California Governor had declared a state of emergency.

> While California transitions to a post-COVID era, these provisions have been employed to ensure essential business is able to continue during natural disasters such as during recent flooding and wildfire events. Absent legislative intervention, the processes established by AB 361 to provide remote meeting flexibility to local agencies in emergency circumstances will expire at the end of this year. To remain best equipped to address future emergencies and allow local agencies to effectively react and respond, eliminating the sunset on the emergency remote meeting procedures is necessary. AB 557 would do exactly this.
