- 5.1 REPORT - Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan Update 2018 - Ongoing Progress Report

Craig Gaevert stated that the intersection of Sixth and A streets at the mall is a major constant conflict and a safety hazard. He asked if it was possible to get signs posted and green paint installed.

Roseland area projects and outreach efforts are ongoing and proceeding.

Concerns about safety of bicyclists and pedestrians, and the need for enforcement at night on the Prince Memorial Greenway were expressed.

8. STAFF ANNOUNCEMENTS

Staff shared positive feedback for the pump track.

Staff is responding to a request from the Humboldt neighborhood to reinstall a four-way stop at the intersection of Humboldt and Spencer that was removed when the Bike Boulevard was installed, and is currently performing research and analysis.
