 - Providing logistical support for Secondary Schools
 - Drug education, intervention, and enforcement
- School Resource Officers positions absorbed by Santa Rosa Police Dept.
- Measure O now community wide focus through Violence Prevention Partnership



School Resource Officers: Police Viewpoint

- Educate students about gangs, drugs, staying safe, making good decisions
- Community engagement
- Better relationships with students
- Mentoring/Role models in school
- Educate and train staff on Critical Incidents on campus

The “Vital Sign” of Truancy

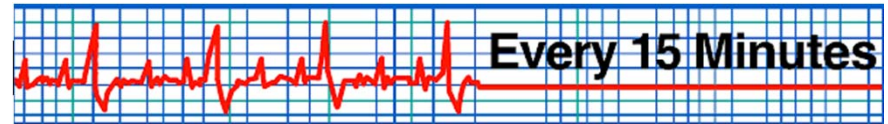
When students aren't attending school, where are they?

- School Attendance Improves Learning (SAIL) Grant
- Focus on “Chronic Absenteeism”
- Elementary school absenteeism is a sign of other family distress
 - SROs Provide important access to City/County services
 - SROs provide strong reinforcement for compulsory education codes
- Secondary school absenteeism is a sign of student needs
- SRO's provide strong meaning to attendance meetings
 - Student Attendance Review Team (SART) Site or
 - Student Attendance Review Board (SARB) District
