Background

- The FY 17-18 State Budget provides funding for the California Violence Intervention and Prevention (CalVIP) Grant Program
- Administered through the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC)
- Cities and Community-based Organizations are eligible to apply
- Regionalized approach and collaboration with other jurisdictions and agencies
- Preference given to cities or regions disproportionately affected by violence and programs that have been shown to be the most effective at reducing violence

CalVIP Grant Application Overview

- May 1, 2018 – April 30, 2020
- \$500,000 for two years
 - Dollar for dollar match requirement – cash or in-kind
 - 60% funding for CalVIP partners (*50% minimum required for community-based organizations*)
 - Measure O and Sonoma County Probation funding leveraged for match requirement
- Positive Youth Justice Framework
 - Santa Rosa Guiding People Successfully (GPS) Program

Santa Rosa GPS Program Overview

- Target Population
 - 200 moderate to high risk youth, ages 12-24
- Multi-Disciplinary Assessment and Referral Team (MDART)
- *Apricot* – Data management system
 - Cross-system approach for referrals and case management
 - In collaboration with Sonoma County Human Services
- 1.0 LTE Wraparound Coordinator (*Community Outreach Specialist*)
 - Partially funded by Measure O and Sonoma County Probation

Santa Rosa GPS Services

- *Tackling the Tough Skills*® – Work readiness and life skills curriculum
- *El Puente* – In-home, family-based mental/behavioral health services
- Case Management – *Individualized Development Plans*
- Paid Work Experience/Job Development
- Evaluation System – defined and measurable objectives
