

# Per Capita Grant Application


- State of California Department of Parks & Recreation Office of Grants and Local Services Per Capita Grant Program
- Revitalization of the playground area at South Davis Neighborhood Park including:
  - New equipment
  - New surfacing
  - Meet current safety and accessibility regulations

# Per Capita Grant Application

- Noncompetitive grant program, part of Proposition 68
- Eligible projects must be a capital outlay for recreational purposes:
  1. Acquisition of land
  2. Development of improvements
- Application is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

# Per Capita Grant Application

- Total estimated project cost is \$290,000
- Santa Rosa's maximum grant award is \$285,291
- Matching funds not required
- Park is in a severely disadvantaged neighborhood.

# Recommendation

It is recommended by the Transportation and Public Works Department, that the Council, by resolution,

1) authorize the submittal of a grant application to the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation Office of Grants and Local Services Per Capita Grant Program for the revitalization of the playground area at South Davis Neighborhood Park in the amount of \$285,291;

# Recommendation

2) authorize the Assistant City Manager to accept the grant and execute a state form of Grant Contract and Deed Restriction, any related grant agreements and any amendments thereto, and all other documents necessary for the completion of the project, subject to approval as to form by the City Attorney; and

3) authorize the Chief Financial Officer to increase appropriations by the amount of the grant award.
