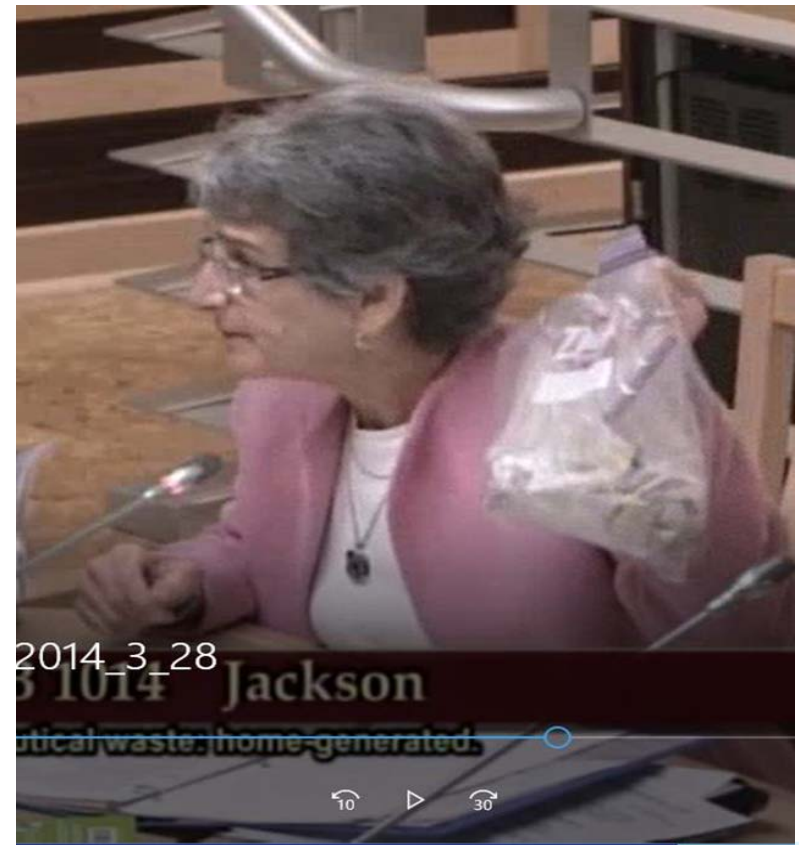

SB 212 Signed!

9/30/18- Governor Jerry Brown signs *Pharmaceutical Drugs and Sharps Take-Back Program* into law!



Senate Bill 212 Timeline

January 1, 2021- Regulation promulgated by CalRecycle

July 1, 2021- Up to 6 months for Stewardship Plan submittal and adoption

October 1, 2021- 90 days for review/approval

June 30, 2022- 270 days to fully implement approved plan

Key Provisions in SB212

Manufacturers

- Set up Take back programs
- Pay for the programs
- Promote
- Education

Convenience “Take Back” Standards

Drug Disposal

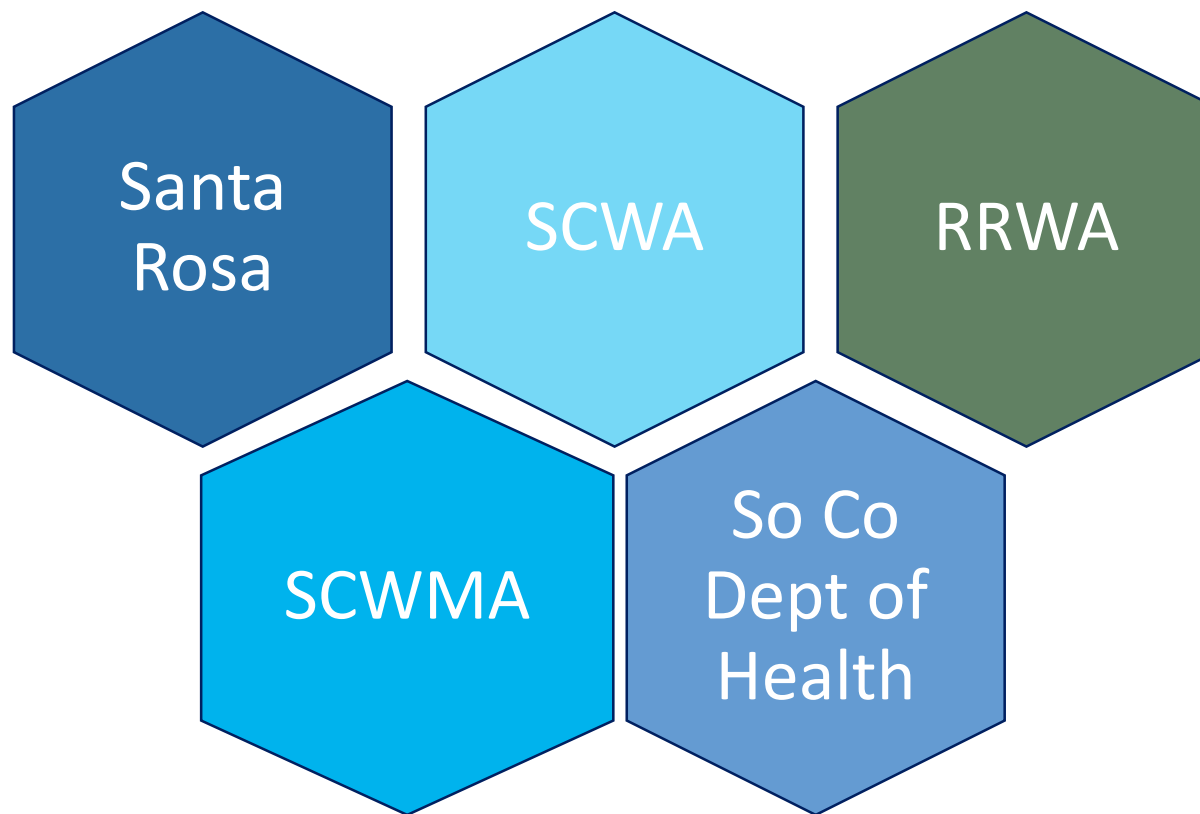
- Requires a bin for every 50,000 people
- Any retail pharmacy, hospital, clinic with an onsite pharmacy or law enforcement agency
- Individuals without ability to deliver to a bin will be able to request prepaid, preaddressed mailing envelopes and containers for safe disposal .

Convenience Standards

Sharps

- Sharps will be collected through a mail-back program where consumers will receive a sharps container and mail-back kit at time of purchase.
- Mandates producers of needles reimburse local governments for any needles they collect and dispose.

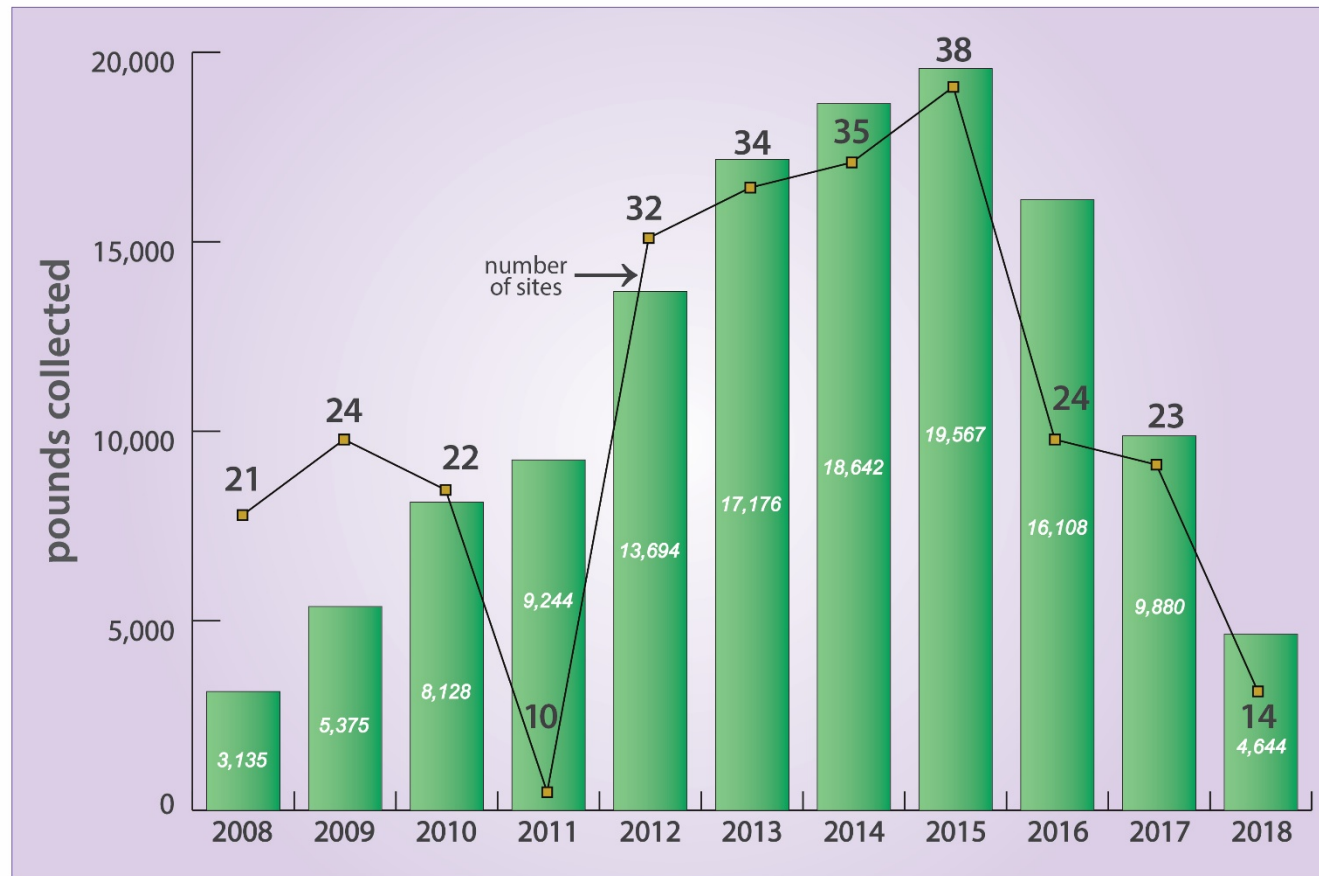
Local Agency Collaborative
