INTRODUCTION

The CAB was created as part of the Santa Rosa City Charter in 2002 and represents views and ideas from the broader community on issues of interest to the Santa Rosa City Council (Council). The CAB is a 7-member board, all of them district-based. The CAB is supported by staff from the Communications and Intergovernmental Relations Office (CIRO).
