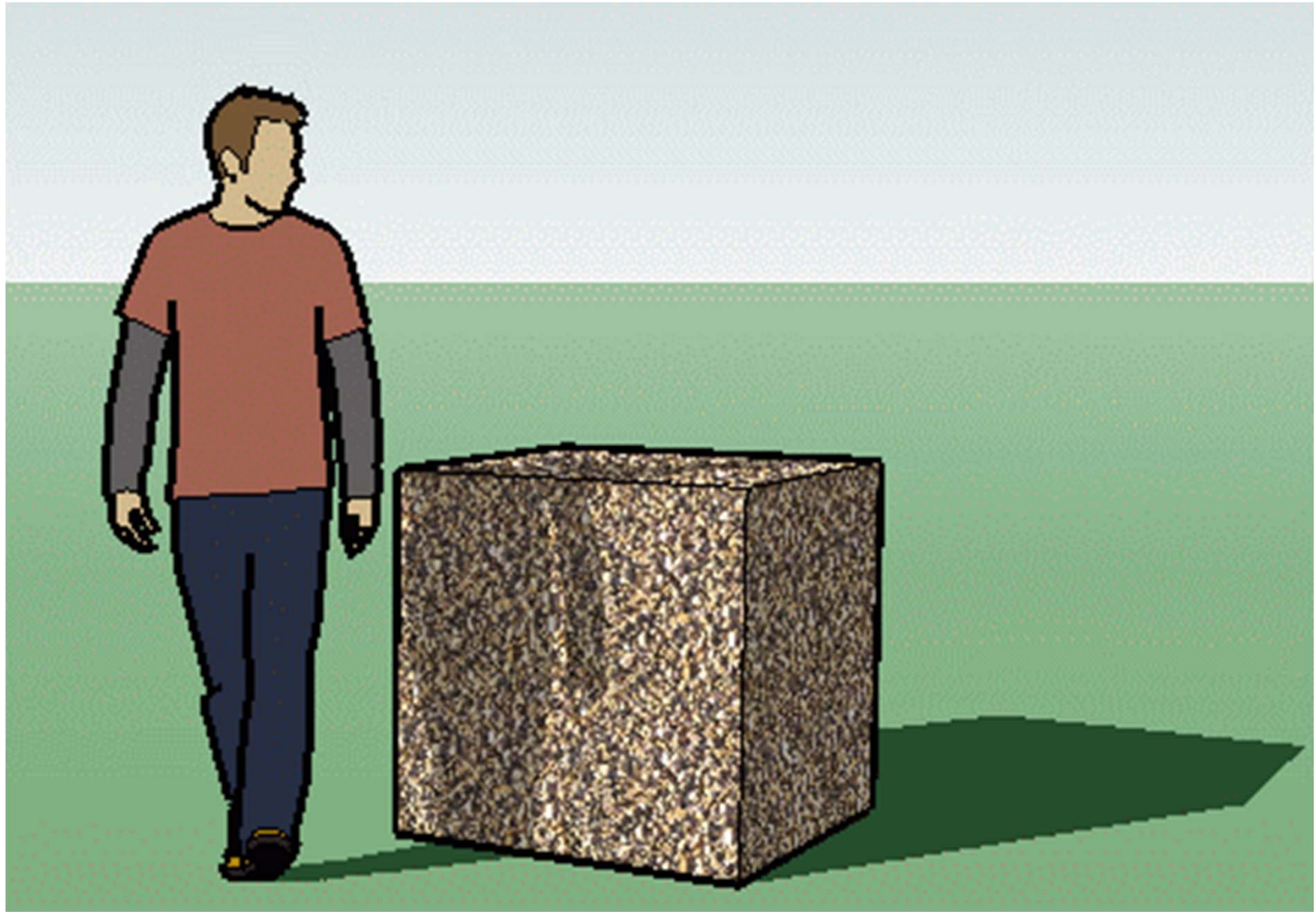

Volunteers

- Volunteers removed a total of 129.9 cubic yards
- 7,176 total volunteer hours conducting Creek Stewardship activities
- Become our “eyes and ears’ on the creeks at all times

80.7 cu yards trash removed
45.8 cu yards invasive species

- Account for 69% of trash removed from creeks in 2017
- Efficient use of Staff time
- Cover large areas of the City

Batteries- **1,303**

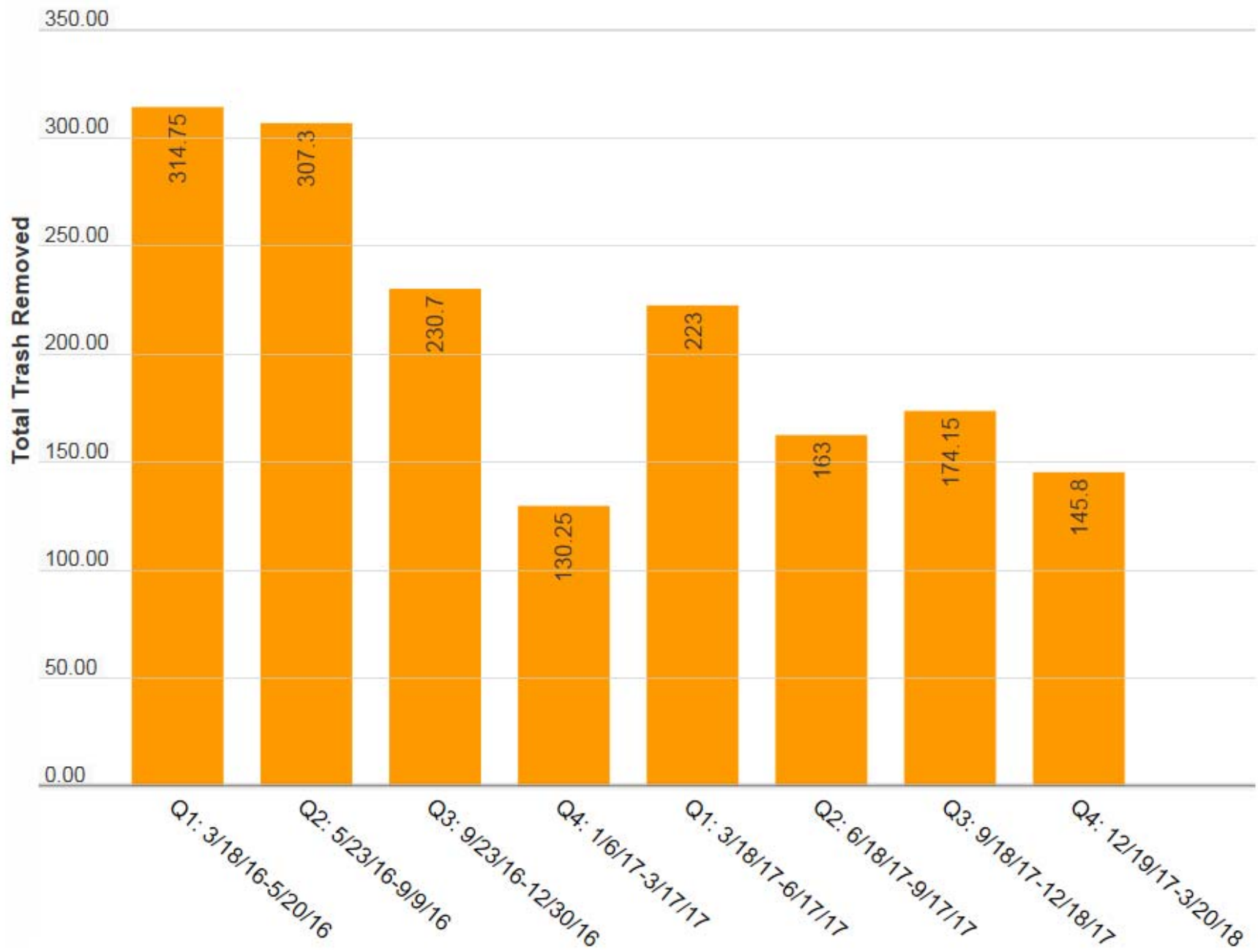
Paint- **14**

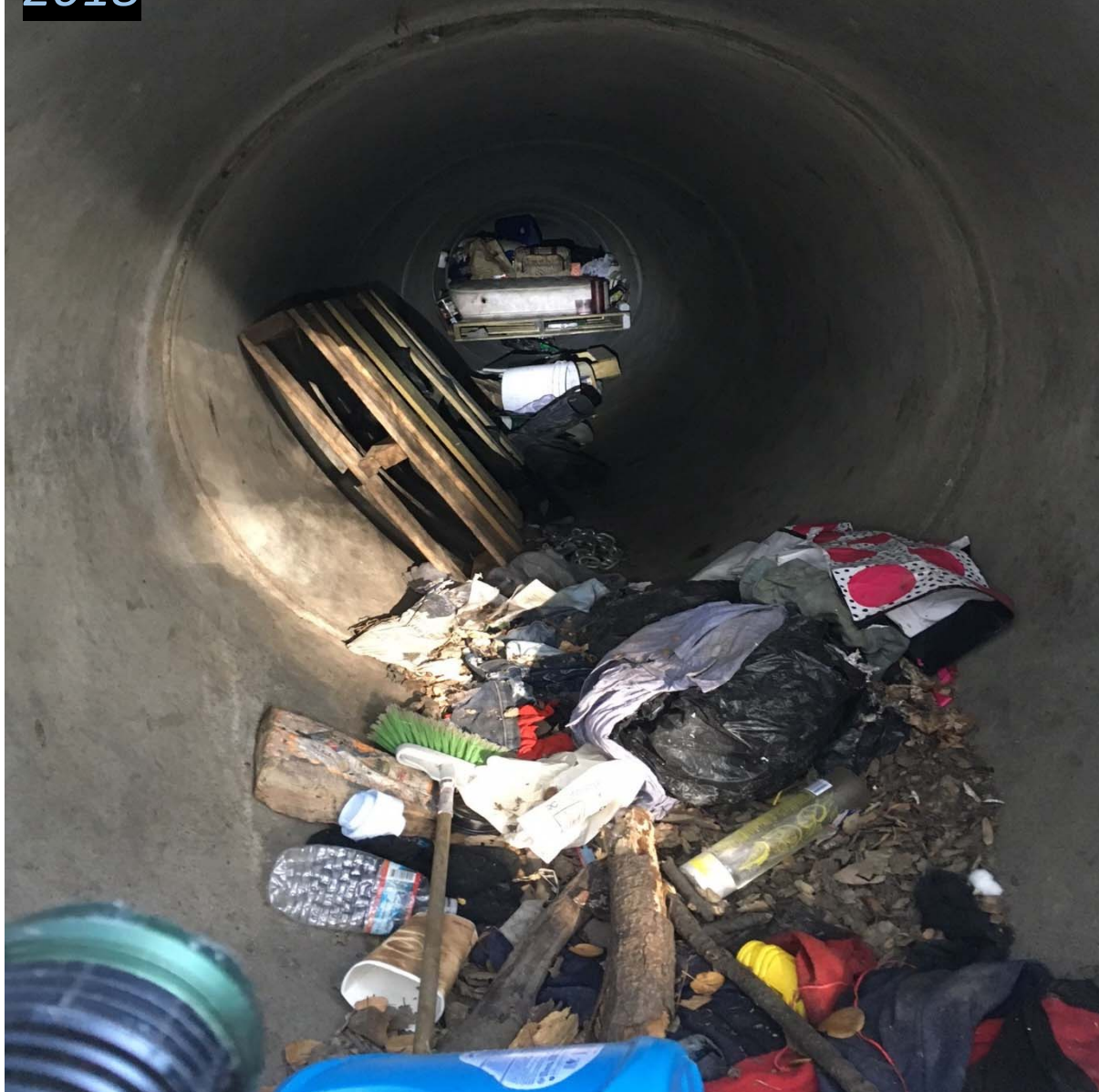


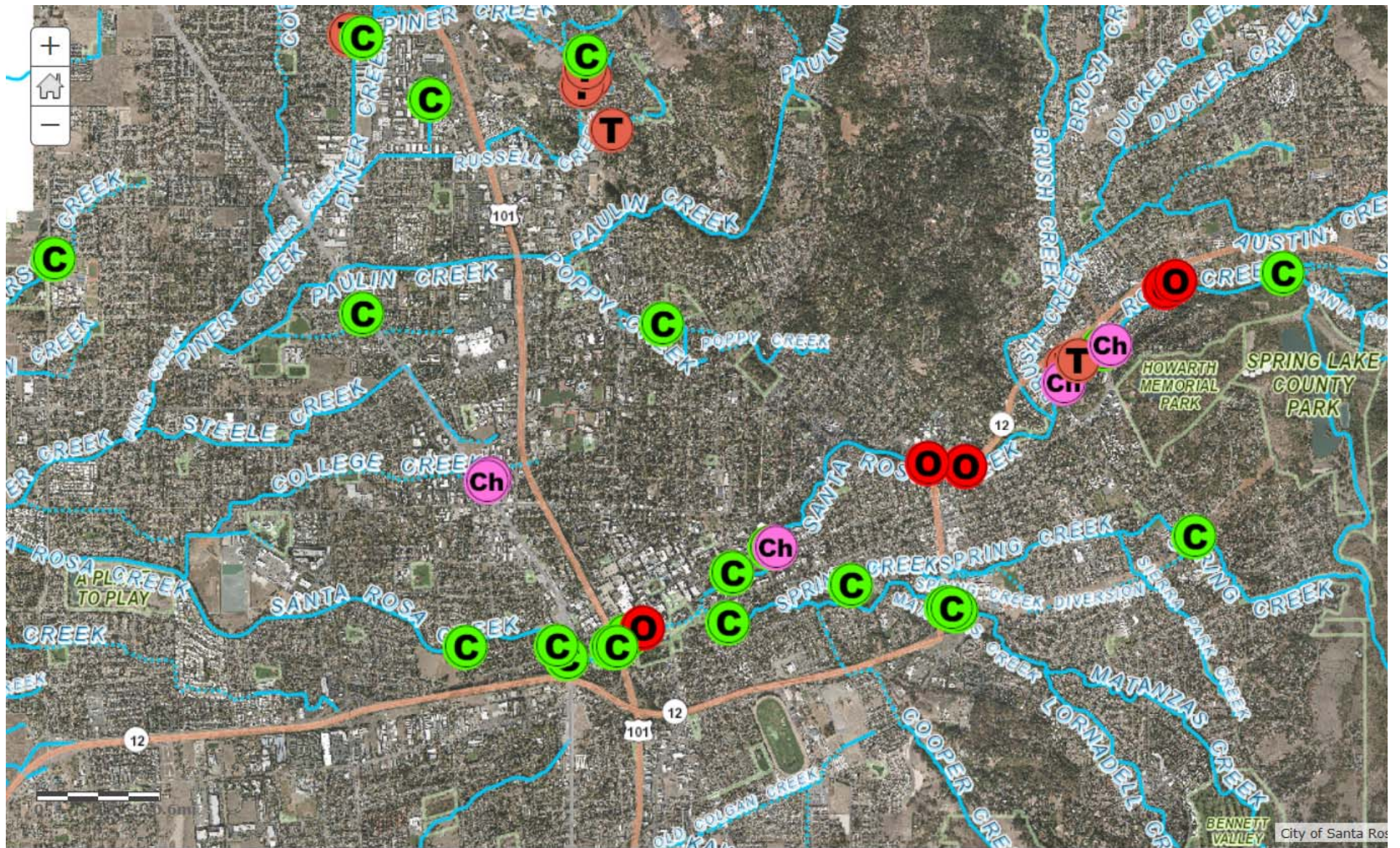

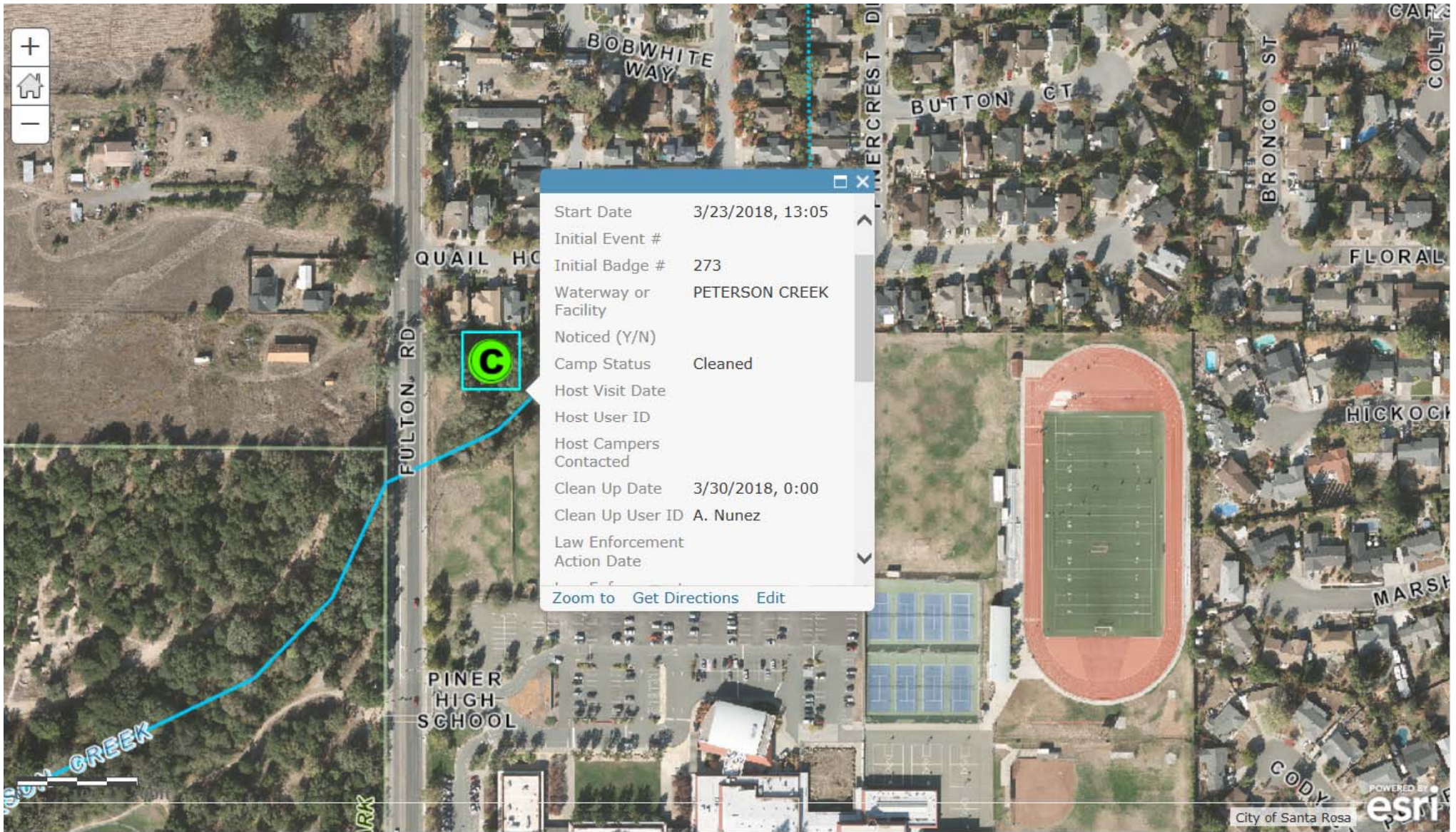
Russell Creek upstream Mendocino Ave 2017
