Background

- June 25th City Council approved Cycle VII funding recommendations
- Six agencies for \$590,000
- One year of funding
- Directed staff to provide additional justification for two-year funding cycle

Research Results cont...

- Reviewed Needs Assessment and Surveyed Grant Applicants
 - Current, past, and agencies who have never received funding
 - All agencies preferred multi-year funding
- CHOICE Grant Review Team
 - Received recommendation to support of multi-year funding
- Reviewed MGPTF Strategic Plan to ensure alignment with CHOICE grant program
- Staff Capacity
 - Increased leadership role with state-wide efforts
 - Additional special projects related to MGPTF Strategic Plan

Research Results cont...

- Focus group with MGPTF Operational Team to assess a one-year versus a two-year funding cycle
 - Increased assessment of long term impacts evidence of behavior change, academic improvement
 - Increased health of agency
 - Increased resources towards direct services
 - A one-year cycle decreases the number of applicants due to staff capacity

Recommendation

- Staff recommends a two-year funding cycle contingent upon the following:
 - Satisfactory performance of work;
 - Compliance with contract obligations;
 - Completion of the required outcomes by funded agencies; and
 - Available funds.
