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Executive Summary

- Establish the design policies and methods governing the public infrastructure
- Should be updated to meet the needs of the community, development, industry, and operations
- City's Charter Section 25 ratified on Nov. 8, 2022 delegated authority of Storm Water to the Board of Public Utilities (BPU)

Executive Summary (continued)

- Consistent with RES-2017-177
- Proposes BPU to recommend, by motion, that City Council:
 - Adopt the revised Public Storm Drain
 Standards as presented, with an effective date 30 days from the date of adoption
 - Delegate authority to the BPU to adopt future revisions to the standards

Background

- Establishes minimum standards for design and construction of public storm drain infrastructure
- Applicability
 - Modifications to the public storm drain infrastructure
 - Capital improvement and private development projects
 - Infrastructure repairs by operations

Background (continued)

- Importance of updates to be consistent with:
 - Federal, state, and local regulations
 - Industry standard practices
 - Operation and maintenance needs
 - Industry needs
 - Changing urban watershed
- Last adopted update: April 2005
- Routed for internal City comments
 - Planning and Economic Development
 - Water
 - Transportation and Public Works


- Routed for public comment

Background (continued)


- Delegation of approval authority
 - Amended City Charter Section 25 delegates
 Future Approval Authority of the City's storm drain infrastructure to BPU
 - RES-2017-177 established precedent

Analysis


- General types of revisions included
 - Formatting
 - Ensuring consistency with federal, state, and local regulations



- Industry support
 - Clarifying, increasing transparency, and formalizing interpretations
 - Address requests from design and construction community
 - Industry standard practices








Operation and maintenance needs





Changing urban watershed and risks





- Why delegate future authority?
 - Consistent with City Charter Section 25
 - RES-2017-177 established precedent for potable water, recycled water, and sewer
 - More timely processing of future revisions

- Effective date
 - Recommend revised standards go into effect 30 days from City Council adoption
 - Only applies to new applications submitted after the effective date
 - As proposed, will limit impacts to the private design community and avoid redesign of plans currently under review

Recommendation

It is recommended by Santa Rosa Water and the Planning and Economic Development Department that the Board of Public Utilities, by motion, recommend the Santa Rosa City (City) Council adopt, by resolution, the revised Public Storm Drain Standards as presented with an effective date 30 days from the date of adoption and delegate authority to the Board of Public Utilities to adopt future revisions to the standards.
