


- Council-initiated circulator shuttle linking RR Square/Downtown SMART station with Courthouse Square and parking garages
- Contracted awarded to MV Transportation for first-year cost of \$180,000
 - Options to extend for two years at \$155,000/year
- Began operations in December 2017






 Ridership has grown but shuttle is carrying low numbers of passengers





Average Passenger Trips Per Hour







Reasons for Low Performance

- SMART ridership as expected
- Low ridership on ParkSMART resulting in high cost per trip
- Lack of interest in parking at Garage 1 on 7th Street
- Parking availability in the Railroad Square Area
- SMART riders prefer walking, kiss-nride, drive to park, biking or transit



Future factors

- SMART ridership will mature
- Efforts to increase density in the Downtown Station area

- Transit Commuter Parking Permit pilot

Potential TDM Program Strategies

- Sonoma County Transportation Authority expects to implement a bike share
- Investigate a program to promote/incentives
 Taxi, Lyft, or vehicles for first mile/last mile
 transportation option
- Continue to optimize CityBus connections with SMART

RECOMMENDATION

- It is recommended by the Finance Department and the Transportation and Public Works Department that the Council, by Resolution, direct staff to,
 - 1) suspend the pilot ParkSMART shuttle service effective March 1, 2019; and
 - 2) further develop a ParkSMART Transportation
 Demand Management (TDM) program to pilot TDM strategies strengthening the link between Railroad Square, the Downtown SMART Station, and the Downtown area.

Alternate solutions

- 1. Reduce to minimum level of service allowed under contract- \$90,000/year.
- 2. Reduce service during the slowest parts of the day \$110,000/year.
- 3. Maintain the current level of service but restructure the hours to test ridership during middle part of the day \$155,000/year.
