



Bid Rejection– Neighborhood Streets Initiative Overlay 2016

BACKGROUND

- On May 25, 2016 staff presented the Neighborhood Streets Initiative to the Community Advisory Board (CAB) with a description of how staff selects candidate streets and associated maintenance treatments.
- On June 22, the CAB reviewed the lists and maps of streets proposed for the Neighborhood Streets Initiative 2016 projects and made a recommendation that Council approve the projects.

ANALYSIS

- The project was advertised on June 24, 2016, and bids were received on July 13, 2016. A total of two (2) bids were received, ranging from \$1,761,140.00 to \$2,222,180.00. The low bid was 1.41% under the Engineer's estimate.
- The recommendation to reject bids is necessary because the low bidder has asked to be relieved of their bid due to a substantial clerical error. Awarding the project to the second low bidder would put the City over budget.

RECOMMENDATION

- It is recommended by the Transportation and Public Works Department that the Council, by resolution, reject all bids for Construction Contract No. C02070 for the Neighborhood Streets Initiative Overlay 2016.
