Background

- “Zag” is a light sculpture by Michael Hayden
- Privately commissioned in 2002 and installed on the pedestrian bridge over the Santa Rosa Creek near Olive Park
- Art was inoperable due to vandalism and lack of maintenance; eventually abandoned by owner

Background

- On October 10, 2016, APPC accessioned “Zag” into the Public Art Collection, recommending repair and relocation
- Relocation from current site on pedestrian bridge over Santa Rosa Creek near Olive Park to pedestrian bridge near to the entry to Prince Memorial Greenway at Prince Gateway Park
- New location more visible
- Per Council Policy 000-42 “Public Art”, relocation of art in Public Art Collection requires Council approval

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Art in Public Places Committee and the Recreation & Parks Department that the Council, by resolution, approve the relocation of “Zag.”
