Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant Application

- State of California Department of Parks & Recreation Office of Grants and Local Services National Park Service Land and Water Conservation Grant Program
- Kawana Springs Community Park Improvements including:
 - Playground and surfacing, Bocce courts, dog park, bicycle pump track, volleyball, turf area
 - Picnic areas, Parking Pavilions, Restroom

LWCF Grant Application

- Competitive Grant program, part of the program based on the foresight of President Kennedy's Administration
- Protection legacy is a provision of Section 6(f)(3) of the LWCF Act
- Protecting Park lands in perpetuity

Eligible projects must be a capital outlay for recreational purposes of either:

1. Acquisition of land
2. Development of recreational features

LWCF Grant Application

- CEQA compliance completed
- Total estimated Project cost is \$5,818,224
- Matching funds are a max of 50 % or \$2,909,112
- Park meets more than one of the required criteria showing need

Recommendation

It is recommended by the Transportation and Public Works Department that the Council, by resolution: 1) authorize the submittal of an application to the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation Office of Grants and Local Services Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant Program, for the improvement of Kawana Springs Community Park for \$2,909,112 in grant funds, which is 50% of the total project cost of \$5,818,224, the remainder of which will be matched by the City; 2) authorize the Assistant City Manager to accept the grant and execute a Grant Contract and any amendments thereto, a Deed Restriction, and all other documents necessary for the completion of the project, subject to approval as to form by the City Attorney; and 3) authorize the Chief Financial Officer to increase appropriations by the amount of the grant award.
