Gang Prevention

BACKGROUND

- August 2012 the administration of the Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force (MGPTF) moved to the City Manager's Office
- December 2012 City Council adopted 2012-2016 MGPTF Strategic Plan
- September 2013 City Manager and City Attorney directed staff to analyze and amend Measure O implementation plan
- December 2013 Citizen's Oversight Committee unanimously accepted the recommended changes to Measure O implementation plan

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED REVISIONS

- Restructure and clarification of funding allocations
- No proposed changes to original line item amounts

City Manager's Office proposes three additional

Limited Term 1.0 FTE Senior Administrative Assistant (January 1 – June 30, 2014)	\$36,500

Data-based evaluation tool to measure long-term impacts of MGPTF efforts on a neighborhood level using public health framework and indicators

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RESPONSIVE GRANT PROGRAM

- Addresses Ordinance Objective:
 - ➤ "Enhancing and improving <u>in-school</u> gang prevention and intervention curriculum and programs"
- Eligible Applicants: School Districts within the City of Santa Rosa
- Evaluation Requirement
- One-time application for up to \$100,000 per award
- 25% matching fund requirement

GRANT REVIEW TEAM

- Representatives from Santa Rosa Police and Recreation & Parks Departments, Sonoma County Office of Education, and Sonoma County Probation
- One community member
- One youth/student
- No conflict of interest

RESPONSIVE GRANT PROCESS

• Process:

- January 2014 Assessment and literature review of successful in-school gang prevention programs
- February 2014
 - ➤ Develop new Request for Proposal
 - ➤ Present Responsive Grant program to MGPTF Policy Team
- March/April 2014 Solicit and review applications from school districts
- May 2014 City Council consideration

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED REVISIONS

- Responsive Grant Program use \$250,000 for in-school gang prevention and intervention programming and curriculum
- MGPTF Strategic Plan Implementation \$125,000
 - Community Awareness Projects
 - Re-entry and Regionalization
 - Community Safety Scorecard
- Limited Term 1.0 FTE Senior Administrative Assistant – \$36,500
 - Administrative support of current and proposed projects



Fire Department

Fire Station 5 Relocation Project



BACKGROUND

- 2002 FIRESCOPE Inc. "Fire Station Location & Deployment Study"
- 2004 Sonoma County Grand Jury Report "Santa Rosa Fire Station Deployment."
- 2004 Santa Rosa General Plan amended. Project estimate: \$4.5 million.
- 2010 City Council approval for project. Project shelved until funding was located.
- 2013 Measure "O" oversight Committee and City Council approve budget of \$350,000 per year of Measure "O" funds.
- October 2013 Project bid. Low bid exceeds Engineers Estimate by \$718,126.

PROPOSED PLAN

- Use \$150,000 currently existing in Fire Station-5 account and,
- Transfer \$600,000 of Measure "O" reserve money from the Southeast Fire Station account.
- The Southeast Fire Station project is currently on hold as there is no current funding for staffing the station. Staff is continuing to work with other agencies to seek a solution that may allow staffing of the station.
