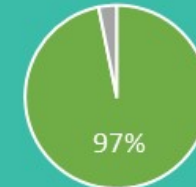

USACE received a debris/removal management mission from FEMA in Lake, Mendocino, Napa and Sonoma Counties. To date, 2.2M tons of debris have been removed. That's equal to the weight of more than two Golden Gate bridges. USACE is working with our local, state and federal partners on the largest wildfire cleanup in California history.

Debris Removal Operations

As of 5-22-2018 (Sonoma County)

- Cal OES, FEMA, & USACE are currently working with each county to cross-reference data and APNs (Assessor's Parcel Number) and validate the status of every parcel in the program.
- Currently, as part of our quality assurance process we are working parcels that are in the final preparation phase requiring additional debris removal as well requiring further action such as soil testing, re-scrapes, installation of erosion control, and car removal.
