

FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022 FOCUSED NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Housing Authority Meeting March 22, 2021

Purpose

- Anticipated Funding: Approximately \$8M in Federal and Local Funds
- Position Projects for Upcoming State Funding Opportunities:
 - CDLAC applications in May 2021
 - 9% Tax Credits 2nd Funding Round applications in July 2021
 - Multifamily Housing Program up to \$140M available in summer 2021

Priorities

- A. New Construction
- B. Target Residents
 - Large families
 - Seniors
 - Workforce
 - Special needs/permanent supportive
 - Veterans
 - People experiencing homelessness

Priorities

- C. Project Qualities/Location
 - Ready to start construction
 - Projects located in High Resource Areas,
 Station Area Plan, Priority Development Area or designated Opportunity Zone
 - Deeper affordability 30% and 50% of AMI
 - Significant projects (multiple civic benefits)

Priorities

- D. Feasibility
 - Project can begin construction within a year
 - Self-scoring of CDLAC and TCAC applications identifies it as a competitive project
 - Developer's qualifications and capacity (time and financial) to carry out the project
 - Maximization of other funding leveraged by the local funds

Point System

Develop Point System

- Projects will be awarded up to 100 points for the purpose of ranking using the following criteria:
 - Readiness up to 10 points
 - Affordability up to 20 points
 - Bedroom Sizes up to 10 points
 - Special Needs Set Aside Units up to 5 Points
 - Leveraging up to 10 points
 - Project Competitiveness (CDLAC/TCAC/MHP scoring) up to 10 points
 - Developer/Manager Experience up to 15 points
 - Services and Amenities up to 10 points
 - Other Factors up to 10 points

 Work with staff to review the applications and make funding recommendation(s) to the Housing Authority.

Direction

 Direction provided by the Housing Authority on priorities, and appointment of a subcommittee, will guide the Focused FY 2021-2022 NOFA process.
