

Accept the City's Annual Report on Development Fees for Fiscal Year 2015-16

HISTORICAL

- Santa Rosa continues to maintain and improve public facilities and infrastructure
- Private developments are required to pay fees for the cost of providing additional infrastructure to support development
- City adopted technical reports to assess infrastructure needs and provide a basis for partial funding with impact fees

BASIS FOR FEES

- New development generates additional residents, traffic and storm run-off, which in turn place additional cumulative burdens upon the City's infrastructure
- Such developments should pay its proportionate share of the cost for new or improved public facilities to meet such burdens

ONGOING REPORTING

- Annual Report identifies anticipated funding sources and estimated amounts of funding necessary to complete financing for identified public improvement projects
- Sets forth anticipated project construction dates
- Future funds will be appropriated and deposited into project accounts as part of annual CIP budget process

RECOMMENDATION

 Adopt findings regarding the use of Southwest Area Development Impact Fees, Southeast Area Development Impact Fees, Capital Facilities Fees and Park Acquisition and Development Fees consistent with State Law; and accept the City's Annual Report on Development Fees for Fiscal Year 2015-16
