



# Community Advisory Board 2021 Community Improvement Grant Questions

- 1. Describe your project, including objectives and goals, and explain how your project will meet these goals.
  - a. Our project is a 22 foot by 45 foot mural featuring a large rose and honey bee to be painted in the center of the traffic diverter in the St. Rose Neighborhood. It will also include a 24"x 30" metal sign that will provide the history of the St. Rose Neighborhood. Planters currently in the diverter (and maintained by residents) will surround the mural. This project will increase the appeal of the area to new comers and established residents alike. The location of the mural near the Brew Café will ensure both those who live in our neighborhood and those passing through will be able to enjoy it.
  - We have received written approval from Rob Sprinkle, Deputy Director for the City's Public Works
    Department since this is city property. (See attached.)
     We will also need approval from the Art in Public Places committee since this project will receive
    city funding. Tara Thompson, the City's Arts & Culture Manager has informed us that The Art in
    Public Places committee will review the design after the grant has been approved.









- 2. What is your outreach plan? We have a neighborhood website we will use to promote this project along with the Nextdoor platform.
- 3. Describe the community support for your project.
  - We have support from Tara Thompson of the Art in Public Places Committee who had this to say "Sounds like a great location for a mural- I am happy to hear you are working on a proposal."
  - Residents are excited about a mural in this location.
- 4. Is there ongoing maintenance required for your project? If so, what is the plan for maintenance and who is going to be responsible? There is minimal need for on-going maintenance as cars do not travel over this area and foot traffic will be light. In addition, our neighborhood has maintained the mural at 9th Street under Hwy. 101 since 2011 so have ten years of experience in this area.
- 5. Projects should reflect environmental consciousness regarding materials, energy, and conservation. We are using the same paint water-based acrylic paint the City uses for street painting. Of course, all precautions will be taken to keep the paint away from waterways.
- 6. Please provide a brief statement on how you will keep project participants safe during implementation. The location within a traffic diverter area is protected from automobile traffic. The surrounding streets have low auto traffic and volunteers will be instructed to be cautious crossing the street which has crosswalks. Gloves will be provided if requested. We will be working outdoors the entire time, but volunteers can wear masks if desired.
