WHEREAS, upon his retirement Alan Silow will be named the symphony's first President and CEO Emeritus in the 95-year history of the Santa Rosa Symphony; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Rosa Symphony has grown to become the third largest in the state, with a music education program that serves some 30,000 young people each year; and

WHEREAS, Alan has led the Santa Rosa Symphony to be widely recognized on the state and national orchestral map for organizational excellence - artistically, educationally, and financially; and

WHEREAS, some of the highlights of Alan's career include: *Accomplishing 20 consecutive years of being cash positive, unsurpassed by any other California orchestra *Overseeing an endowment fund that grew from \$1.5 million to \$17 million today *Displaying commanding leadership that helped rejuvenate a capital fundraising campaign to raise \$145 million to build Sonoma State University's world-class Green Music Center, where Santa Rosa Symphony has been the resident orchestra since 2012; and

WHEREAS, Alan's legacy of leadership as a champion of the arts has made a meaningful difference in our community;
