Our City's schools are currently in financial crisis because of long term declining enrollment. Declining enrollment is due to myriad factors that districts have no control over. California projects a 20% decline in the student age population over the next decade

County Enrollment Trends

2010: 73,000 students

2025: 60,000 students

Projected 2040: Less than 50,000 students



In 2021, Santa Rosa City Schools commissioned a consolidation report. The consultant's extensive report, with over 2,000 hours of research, proposed three different possibilities. SRCS choose the scenario that would lead to a reduction of funding by a total of 21.3 million dollars.

The high number of school districts in Santa Rosa comes at greater administrative cost. Santa Rosa spends 9 million more a year on administration than districts that are similarly sized to our 9 districts. More administrators do not provide a better student outcome.

**Possible Financial Benefit of District Consolidation:
Over 29 million per year.**

The SRCS Consolidation report included a proposal that would lead to a total of \$29 million dollars in additional funding and cost savings from cutting redundant administration. This was ignored. Consolidating districts will help our communities deal with declining enrollment while improving student outcomes.
