

RESOLUTION NO. RES-2024-023

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA ROSA APPROVING A PROJECT SPECIFIC MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT NO. TR04-22HB15 BETWEEN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ACTING THROUGH ITS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (CALTRANS), AND THE CITY OF SANTA ROSA OUTLINING THE REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES FOR INSPECTING, EVALUATING, AND MAINTAINING THE HIGHWAY 101 BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City would like to construct a pedestrian and bicycle overcrossing at US Highway 101 (Project) to include a 5-foot-wide sidewalk and an 8-foot-wide bike path, which will provide a much-needed improvement to the existing pedestrian & bicycle connectivity, and reduce pedestrian/ vehicle conflict, and improve more opportunities for alternative transportation; and

WHEREAS, Caltrans has requested that the City adopt a resolution approving and authorizing the execution of a Project Specific Maintenance Agreement in conformance with Caltrans' project development process to advance the Project; and

WHEREAS, a maintenance agreement between the City and Caltrans is necessary in order to establish agency responsibilities for inspecting, evaluating and maintaining the bridge.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Santa Rosa approves the Project Specific Maintenance Agreement No. TR04-22-HB15, in substantially the same form attached to this resolution as Exhibit A and made a part of herein, subject to approval as to form by the City Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to sign the agreement.
