- Applications opened **February 1 to March 31, 2025**, for events scheduled between **July 1 through Dec. 31, 2025**.
- Organizations may be a for or non profit. Events may be ticketed or free to attend
- Must take place in Santa Rosa City limits.
- Event Support amounts are determined by how well the event addresses program guidelines, eligibility, and funding availability year to year.
- To qualify for SRTBIA funding events must attract visitors, tailor marketing efforts outside of Sonoma County and neighboring counties as well as contribute to destination vitality and placemaking. These events may be ticketed or free to attend.

- How well does the event meet the authorized uses of the BIA funding; to
 promote and encourage tourism which will benefit the operators of lodging
 establishments paying assessments, through the promotion of the scenic,
 recreational, cultural and other attractions designed to increase overnight visits
 to the area.
- How well does the proposed use of Event Support Funds meet guidelines for eligible expenses (city services, venue fees, advertising, event marketing inside or outside the area designed to promote overnight visits)?
- How well does the proposed use of Event Support Funds meet the guidelines? The funding should NOT be the sole source of funding for the event and/or used for the organization's staff/employee wages or salaries.

- How well does the proposed event contribute to the goal of the Santa Rosa Tourism Business Improvement Area (SRTBIA) to increase overnight visits to the area.
- How effectively does the proposed event plan to market outside of Sonoma and neighboring counties?

- How well does the event demonstrate long term sustainability with additional funding sources
