WHEREAS, for the last four years, *The Roseland Parents Club*, a group of Roseland parents with support from St. Joseph Health and in collaboration with organizations such as the Sonoma County Community Development Commission, Sonoma County Department of Health Services, Sonoma County Regional Parks, Community Action Partnership of Sonoma's Community Building Initiative, and Raizes Collectivas, is working to make a positive health change for Roseland residents – creating and championing access to healthy foods, safe spaces for exercise and community education opportunities; and
