

PROTOCOL FOR ELECTION OF MAYOR

City Council Meeting August 18, 2015

Current Protocol

- Incumbent Mayor/Vice Mayor calls for nominations from the floor
- Nomination must receive a second and be accepted by nominee
- Nominations are voted on in order received
- Once a nomination receives a majority vote, no action is taken on remaining nominations



Issue

- Current protocol does not address who conducts the election in absence of presiding officer
- Occurred following 2014 election
- Council authorized City Clerk to conduct election by accepting nominations through random draw
- Council directed staff to bring forward proposed protocols to resolve issue



Presiding Officer - Option 1

- Same as current protocol
- In absence of a presiding officer, Council Member with longest period of continuous service is presiding officer for election of Mayor
- If multiple members with equal length of service, City Clerk conducts drawing prior to meeting to determine presiding officer



Presiding Officer - Option 2

- Same as current protocol
- Same as Option 1 Council Member with longest period of continuous service is presiding officer for election of Mayor
- If multiple members with equal length of service, highest number of electorate votes received determines presiding officer



Voting – Option

• If more than one nomination, Council votes by ballot using the process employed for voting on board and commission applicants



Staff Recommendation

It is recommended by the City Clerk that the Council, by motion, (1) establish protocols for the election of Mayor; and (2) direct the City Clerk to incorporate the protocols into the Council's Manual of Protocols and Procedures for approval by the City Council.
