

Public Hearing: Petition to Expand the Talbot/Memorial Residential Permit Parking Zone to Include the 100 Block of Sotoyome Street

CURRENT

- The Downtown Residential Permit Parking Zone was established on March 20, 2007.
- City Code Section 11-44.050 establishes process for creating or amending residential permit zones



PROPOSED

- A petition has been received from residents of the 100 block of Sotoyome Street to expand the Downtown Residential Permit Parking Zone
- The street currently has two-hour time limited parking from 9 am to 6 pm, Monday –Saturday to limit visitors and employees of nearby hospital and medical offices from using all the street parking
- If approved, residents may purchase permits exempting them from time limits

PROPOSED EXPANSION TO THE RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONE



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BENEFIT

- Approval of this item will provide relief to residents, allowing them to park beyond posted time limits in the permit zone.
- The two-hour time limit will continue to serve as a deterrent to long term spill over parking, freeing up parking spaces for residents.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Finance
Department that Council, by resolution,
approve the petition to add the 100 block of
Sotoyome Street to the Talbot/Memorial
Residential Permit Parking Zone.
