RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the City Manager and the Finance Department that the Council hold a Study Session to provide an opportunity for the City Council to receive information and ask questions relative to the General Fund's financial stability and the proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21 Operations and Maintenance Budget and the Capital Improvement Program budget. No action is necessary.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In this budget Study Session, the City Council will be presented with an overview of the funding requests for FY 2020-21. The Study Session is held in advance of the Budget Hearings in June to allow the City Council ask questions, provide direction, and gain a full understanding of the budget before formal adoption in June.

BACKGROUND

The City's budget process began in January. The City held a public hearing on budget priorities on February 25, 2020, to solicit input from the community on items to be considered in the budget. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the shelter-in-place order, the City Council's goal setting meetings were canceled this year. City departments completed entry of their proposed budgets and were reviewed by budget staff. On April 28, 2020, the City Council was presented with the General Fund's Long Range Financial Forecast including the revenue loss forecast and state of the reserves.
