> BACKGROUND: On May 29, 2019 the City released a Request for Developer Qualifications/Proposals for a low-income development on City Property, located at 702 & 716 Bennett Valley Road, and 921 & 927 Rutledge Avenue, Santa Rosa, also known as the former Bennett Valley Senior Center. Freebird Development, LLC and Allied Housing, Inc. (collectively "Developer") was chosen by Council on September 24, 2019, and an Exclusive Negotiation Agreement was negotiated and approved by Council on May 19, 2020. Since that time, the Developer has completed entitlements for the proposed project and Staff, pursuant to Council's direction on price and terms, and Developer have negotiated the Disposition and Development Agreement substantially in the form attached as Exhibit A and subject to City Attorney approval.

> RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended by the Housing and Community Services and Transportation and Public Works Department that Council, by resolution, approve the Disposition and Development Agreement on City property located at 702 & 716 Bennett Valley Road and 921 & 927 Rutledge Avenue, Santa Rosa, CA with Freebird Development Company, LLC and Allied Housing Inc., substantially in the form attached as Exhibit A and subject to City Attorney approval.

15.2 REPORT - AMENDMENTS TO THE OPEN GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE

BACKGROUND: On December 8, 2020, Council adopted Ordinance No. ORD-2020-018 adding Chapter 1-10, "Open Government" to Title 1 of the Santa Rosa City Code. The Ordinance established guidelines for public access to meetings, disclosure of public records, website information, agenda publication requirements for regular meetings, and meeting minutes. The effective date of the Ordinance was set for July 1, 2021, to allow time for development of required procedures and protocols.

Council directed staff to start implementation of the directives in the ordinance in advance of the effective date in order to assess and analyze impacts and issues. More time for this analysis is needed.

In addition, several significant issues have emerged in connection with the early publication dates of the Preliminary and Regular meeting agendas. Adjustments to those publication dates may be appropriate.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended by the Mayor and the City Clerk that Council introduce an ordinance amending Chapter 1-10.030 (A) and (C) of Ordinance No. ORD-2020-018 to revise the publication dates of the Preliminary and Regular meeting agendas, and to revise Chapter 1-10.170 Section 4, to establish a new Ordinance effective date of January 1, 2022.

*15.3 REPORT - ADOPTION OF STAGE 3 - MANDATORY 20% REDUCTION IN WATER USE OF THE CITY'S WATER SHORTAGE

CONTINGENCY PLAN

BACKGROUND: On April 21, 2021, the Governor declared a local drought emergency for Sonoma and Mendocino counites. On April 27, 2021, the County of Sonoma declared a local drought emergency. On May 14, 2021, Sonoma Water, the City's water wholesale supplier, filed a Temporary Urgency Change Petition with the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) requesting a reduction of releases from Lake Mendocino and Lake Sonoma to preserve critical water supply storage. On June 14, 2021, the State Board issued a Temporary Urgency Change Order that allows Sonoma Water to reduce their releases from Lake Mendocino and Lake Sonoma to preserve critical water supply storage. The Order also requires Sonoma Water to reduce their diversions from the Russian River beginning July 1 by 20% over 2020 levels. Sonoma Water will therefore be allocating water to their water contractors, including Santa Rosa Water. Adopting Stage 3 of the City's Water Shortage Contingency Plan is required to reduce retail demand and achieve targets consistent with Santa Rosa Water's allocation.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended by Santa Rosa Water that the Council: 1) by motion, find good cause, under the Early Agenda Policy and the Open Government Ordinance, to consider this item, notwithstanding that the item did not appear on the preliminary agenda; and by resolution, 2) declare a drought emergency; 3) adopt Stage 3 - Mandatory 20% Reduction in Water Use of the City's Water Shortage Contingency Plan; 4) direct staff to implement the water conservation program as defined by Stage 3 to realize a community-wide water use reduction of up to 20%; and 5) authorize the utilization of Water Enterprise Catastrophic Reserve funds, if necessary.

BACKGROUND: Water and wastewater demand fees, one-time fees charged for new development, are updated periodically to adjust the fees based on current system valuation and customer usage. On August 26, 2014, the 2014 Water and Wastewater Demand Fee Study and the current demand fee schedule were adopted by City Council.

The proposed 2021 demand fee update will increase the demand fee per one thousand gallons of water and wastewater. However, residential categories, based on Santa Rosa Water customer usage, have reduced resulting in the combined 2021 water and wastewater demand fees being less than the current combined demand fees.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended by the Board of Public Utilities and Santa Rosa Water, that the Council: 1) by resolution, approve the amended water demand fee schedule; and 2) introduce an ordinance amending Chapter 15-16 of the Santa Rosa City Code to incorporate the approved sewer demand fee schedule, re-adopting the annual adjustments, and make related changes.

FACILITIES IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY AND RESOLUTION ADOPTING DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS FOR SUCH FACILITIES

BACKGROUND: The Planning and Economic Development Department is proposing the introduction of an ordinance amending the Santa Rose Municipal Code to add Chapter 13-06 to Title 13 Streets, Sidewalks and Public Places. The proposed amendment will bring the City's regulation of wireless facilities within the public right-of-way into compliance with Federal and State laws. The addition of this code sections will ensure to the greatest extent possible that wireless facilities are located, designed, installed, constructed, maintained and operated in a manner that meets the aesthetic and public health and safety requirements of the City. The proposed ordinance addresses the type of wireless facilities that are exempt, permitted, conditionally permitted and prohibited within the City's public right-of-way. The proposed ordnance further outlines the general procedures for permit approval and abandonments.

The Planning and Economic Development Department is also proposing a resolution that will establish design and development standards for the placement of wireless facilities within the public right-of-way. The design and development standards will set forth specific construction and placement requirements that will attempt to balance the deployment of wireless facilities and associated wireless support structures in the public right-of-way to protect fast reliable cellular coverage and capacity, while preserving the character, safety and aesthetics of the City's street scape.
