


Nayeli Rivera

Storefront retailers can also deliver cannabis goods.</p>	<p>Stands for indoor cultivation using exclusively artificial lighting between 5,001 and 10,000 square feet, inclusive, of total canopy size on one premises</p>	<p>Type 11 distributors can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Move cannabis and cannabis products between cultivation, manufacturing or distribution premises• Move finished cannabis goods to retail premises• Provide storage services to other licensees• Arrange for testing of cannabis goods	<p>Type 7 manufacturers can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use volatile solvents for extraction or post processing (refinement) of cannabis extract• Use non-volatile solvents for extraction or post processing• Use mechanical methods for extraction• Make cannabis products through infusion• Package and label cannabis products
