## Charter Requirement

Section 10. Task Force: Citizen & Neighborhood Participation

(b) The Council shall establish a District Commission encompassing the entire City. The Commission shall be composed of the representatives of seven to fourteen districts, whose boundaries shall be established by the Council. The representatives of each district shall advise the Council regarding city matters, including 1) public safety issues; 2) participation in neighborhood planning meetings within the district; and 3) CIP **budget priorities for their district.** Each district representative, at the time of appointment and during his or her service as such, shall be, and remain a resident of the district he or she is appointed to represent. represent.

- Mandated/Required
- Safety
- Environmental Hazard Mitigation
- Funding
  - Fully Funded
  - Fund Specific
  - Fund Requirements/Timelines (Grants)
- Project Readiness
- Fire Recovery

Scoring is flat across all criteria

Proposed CIP Prioritization Plan Revisions

#### Following February 24, 2021, CAB meeting

- Review of other jurisdiction plans
- Focus on Oakland's Prioritization Plan
  - Interviewed implementing manager
  - 12-18 month implementation
  - Significant community involvement
  - Equity is primary prioritization lens
  - Other different valuable criteria
    - Health & Safety
    - Economy
- Work with Executive Staff to develop interdisciplinary committee to conduct community engagement to validate plan
