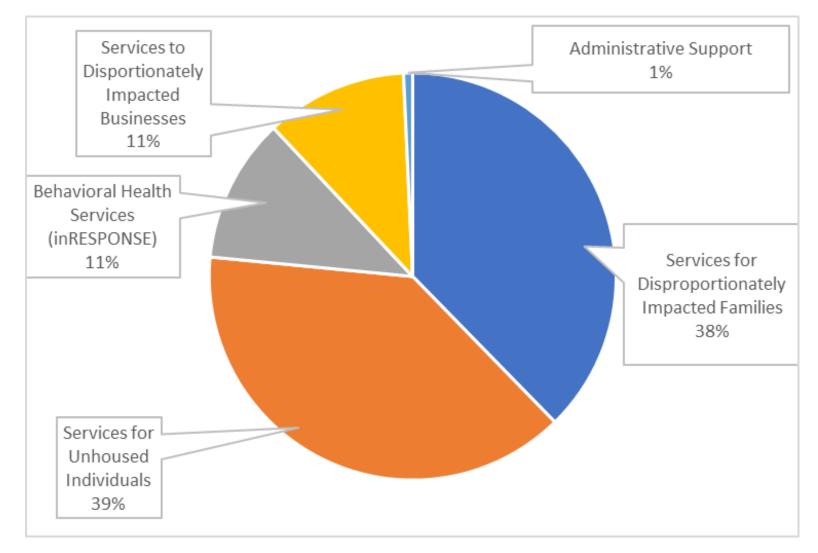

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

- Spending plan includes programs to which Council provided consensus to move forward
- Also includes funds for construction of Roseland Community Center
- Decreased COVID-19 testing and part of third year costs for Homeless Services Budget to fit within City allocation
- City Allocation = \$34,637,465; City Plan = \$34,637,000



ARPA Spending Plan

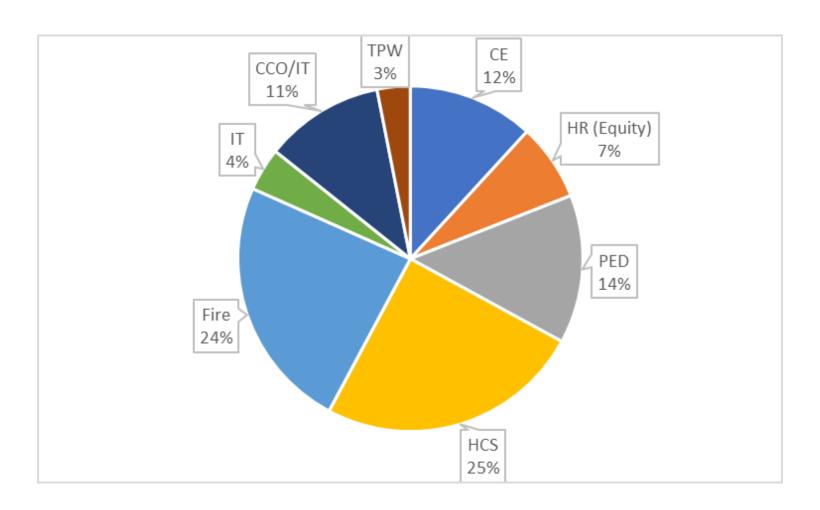
