RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA ROSA APPROVING THE PG&E SETTLEMENT FUNDS PROJECT LIST ASSOCIATED WITH TUBBS FIRE RECOVERY AND APPROPRIATE THE FUNDS

WHEREAS, in 2017 the City of Santa Rosa was devastated by the Tubbs Fire resulting in the most devastating wildfire in California history at that time; and

WHEREAS, the city worked with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and California Office of Emergency Services to evaluate public infrastructure damage and create projects per the Stafford Act and FEMA Public Assistance and Policy Guide; and

WHEREAS, 29 projects were defined with an initial estimate of approximately \$111 million; and

WHEREAS, as of the date of this meeting 16 projects have been completed, 4 projects have been withdrawn, the Direct Administrative Cost project must be last and the remaining 8 projects are near completion or in process; and

WHEREAS, FEMA denied several project components including road and sidewalk damage resulting from the debris removal mission, restoration of vegetation and landscaping, donated resources, and the relocation of Fire Station No. 5; and

WHEREAS, PG&E settled a complaint filed by the City associated with the Tubbs Fire with a payment of \$95 million; and

WHEREAS, the Coffey Park, Fountaingrove and Hidden Valley neighborhoods devastated by the Fire have requested assistance by the City to repair damaged road, sidewalk, and landscape infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2021, Council unanimously requested that staff set aside \$20 million of the PG&E Settlement funds to support three projects:

- Hopper Avenue Sidewalk, Landscape and Pavement Restoration
- Park & Landscape Vegetation Restoration
- Residential Street Pavement Repair; and

WHEREAS, the City is the recipient of approximately \$34 million through the Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery program through the Mitigation and Infrastructure program elements; and

WHEREAS, working with the State Department of Housing and Community Development, staff has been forced to change eligible projects within the Mitigation and Infrastructure programs over the past eighteen months; and WHEREAS, it is appropriate to reassign PG&E Settlement funds to ensure all eligible projects are fully funded; and

WHEREAS, additional unfunded and ineligible roadway segments damaged by the debris removal mission have been identified which could be repaired if any PG&E Settlement funds designated for Tubbs Fire Recovery projects goes unspent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Santa Rosa approves adjusting the eligible project list for PG&E Settlement funds to include the reconstruction of Fire Station No. 5.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council appropriates the PG&E Settlement funds designated for Tubbs Fire Recovery projects as follows:

- \$3,824,820 to JL 05018 Fire Station No. 5
- \$3,175,180 to JL 17607 Residential Street Pavement Repair
- \$7,000,000 to JL 17656 Park & Landscape Vegetation Restoration
- \$6,000,000 to JL 17655 Hopper Avenue Sidewalk, Landscape and Pavement Restoration

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Assistant City Manager is authorized to shift funds between other Tubbs Fire Recovery projects as needed to cover actual costs associated with the following projects:

- JL 17580 OBAG 2 Pavement Rehab
- JL 17626 Fire Damaged Roadway Landscaping Irrigation
- JL 17628 Fire Damaged Roadway Landscaping Fountaingrove Revegetation
- JL 17657 Fire Damaged Roadway Landscaping Roadway Landscape Revegetation
- JL 17640 Fire-Damaged Tree Removal Phase 3
- JL 17606 FHWA Fire-Related Permanent Recovery Project
- JL 17658 Fire Damaged Pavement Segments Non-Reimbursable
