RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the City Manager and Finance Department that the City Council hold a Study Session intended to provide City Council the opportunity to receive information and ask questions related to the City's overall financial stability and the proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 Operations and Maintenance Budget and the Capital Improvement Program budget. This item is provided for Council's information and no action is required.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In this Study Session, staff will present City Council with an overview of the funding requests for FY 2022-23, as well as perspectives as to overall funding considerations. The Study Session is held in advance of the Budget Hearings in June to provide the opportunity for City Council to ask questions, provide direction, and gain a full understanding of the budget and resulting financial implications for the City ahead of formal budget adoption in June.

BACKGROUND

The City's budget process began in January. The City held a public hearing on budget priorities on February 15, 2022, to solicit community input for proposed considerations. This was followed with City Council goal-setting meetings February 24 & 25, 2022. City departments completed entry of their proposed budgets and those submissions have been reviewed by budget staff.
