Good afternoon,

I am writing to express the need for a safe, connected network of bicycle lanes in Santa Rosa. I live in the Roseland neighborhood and ride a bike to work as well as shop and take my kids to school by bike. As we continue to rapidly drain the finite supply of fossil fuels that our society runs on, it is becoming more and more clear that we need viable alternatives to depending on these increasingly costly fuels for everyday transportation. Many of my friends and neighbors are interested in travelling by bike or ebike but cite lack of safe infrastructure as the main impediment to doing so. Cars remain dominant in our city and our psyche despite the incredible toll they take in paved space that could be put to better uses, to noise and air pollution, to the incredible expense of keeping a car that is foisted upon the poorest and most vulnerable in the community, and to the millions worldwide whose lives are lost or forever changed due to traffic violence every year, a threat that is increasingly dangerous for those of us outside of vehicles. When planning a car trip, we ask which route is most direct or fastest. When planning a bike trip, we have to ask which way has the lowest chance of myself and my children being killed. While infrastructure like the new bike bridge over highway 101 is welcome and sorely needed, this infrastructure is only as valuable as the safe connections on either side of it. We have a great goal in vision zero and we have a great plan in our bike/ped master plan – all we need now is leadership that is willing to work urgently to prioritize urgent implementation to realize that goal. I implore you to prioritize cycle networks that are safe for all ages and abilities in this budget cycle to the greatest extent possible. The need has never been clearer.
