



CITY OF SANTA ROSA NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

ON THE PROPOSED ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$465 MILLION OF REVENUE BONDS BY THE CALIFORNIA MUNICIPAL FINANCE AUTHORITY TO FINANCE THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION, AND EQUIPPING OF AURORA SANTA ROSA HOSPITAL, A MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY, LOCATED AT 1265 THROUGH 1287 FULTON ROAD AND 2598 GUERNEVILLE ROAD, SANTA ROSA

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be conducted by the City Council on Tuesday, January 10, 2023, at or after 5:00 p.m., utilizing a hybrid public meeting format. The purpose of the public hearing will be to receive public comment and recommendations prior to the City Council acting on approval of the issuance, by the California Municipal Finance Authority (the “Authority”), a joint powers authority of which the City of Santa Rosa (the “City”) is a member, of tax-exempt revenue bonds or other obligations in an aggregate amount of Four Hundred Sixty-Five Million Dollars (\$465,000,000) including but not limited to revenue bonds, issued as part of a plan to finance or refinance the facilities described herein (the “Bonds”). The proceeds of the Bonds will be used to finance the acquisition, construction, renovation, and equipping of Aurora Santa Rosa Hospital, a mental health facility, including facilities which are functionally related and subordinate to the main hospital facilities (the “Project”), located at 1265 through 1287 Fulton Road and 2598 Guerneville Road, Santa Rosa, California, and pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the Bonds and capitalized interest on the Bonds and to fund certain reserves.

The owner, borrower, and operator of the Project will be QCF/I, Inc., a 501(c)(3) nonprofit healthcare organization, a wholly owned subsidiary, or subsidiaries thereof, or a single member limited liability company or companies that is or are disregarded entities for federal tax purposes.

The Bonds and the obligation to pay principal thereof and interest thereon and any redemption premium with respect thereto will not constitute indebtedness or an obligation of the City, the Authority, the State of California, or any political subdivision thereof, within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory debt limitation, or a charge against the general credit or taxing powers of any of them. None of the City, the State of California, or any political subdivision thereof will have any obligation to repay the Bonds or to acquire, construct, improve, equip or operate the Project. The Bonds shall be a limited obligation of the Authority, payable solely from certain revenues generally representing amounts derived from the Borrower.
