We have utilized Social Media for our past events.(with great success) We will distribute flyers to Indian Health, talking circles and Native American Youth clubs. We will have a google form for individuals to sign up. We plan on placing announcements on public boards as well. We are offering this for free and volunteering to remove any obstacle of cost.

Residents are Aphrodite Obezo and myself, Maria Cardenas who have been cultural advocates for 7 years.

b. What roles are they playing and how collaborative is the project?

We are planning, teaching, hosting and recruiting.

We have elders in our community who want to come and share knowledge. This is teaching how to sew to talking to allies on better approaches on cultural etiquette.

Native communities have been hit hard my covid-19. We are asking for those who attend to test 2 hours prior to the start of class. Those who are vaccinated will be optional for a mask in accordance with local guidelines. We will have masks and hand sanitizers at the door in case anyone has forgotten. (We have ability to provide the test)
